A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to powers and duties of navigation districts and the
- 3 boards of trustees of municipal port facilities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 60.403, Water Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 (a) A port commission, an authorized designated officer of
- 9 the port commission, the executive director of the district or the
- 10 port authority, or an authorized representative of the executive
- 11 director may make routine purchases or contracts in an amount not to
- 12 exceed \$50,000, provided that a port commission may delegate
- 13 <u>authority</u> to an authorized designated officer of the port
- 14 commission, the executive director of the district or the port
- 15 authority, or an authorized representative of the executive
- 16 director to make routine purchases or contracts in an amount not to
- 17 <u>exceed \$100,000</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 60.4035(a), Water Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (a) Notwithstanding the competitive bidding requirements
- 21 and proposal procedures of this subchapter and Subchapter O and the
- 22 requirements of Sections 60.408(a), (b), (c), (d), and (e), the
- 23 executive director of a district or an officer of a district
- 24 authorized in writing by the port commission may make emergency

- 1 purchases or contracts or emergency amendments to existing purchase
- 2 orders or contracts in an amount that exceeds the amount authorized
- 3 under Section 60.403(a) for routine purchases or contracts if
- 4 necessary:
- 5 (1) to preserve or protect the public health and
- 6 safety of the residents of the district;
- 7 (2) to preserve the property of the district in the
- 8 case of a public calamity;
- 9 (3) to repair unforeseen damage to the property of the
- 10 district; [or]
- 11 (4) to respond to security directives issued by:
- 12 (A) the federal Department of Homeland Security,
- 13 including the Transportation Security Administration;
- 14 (B) the United States Coast Guard;
- 15 (C) the federal Department of Transportation,
- 16 including the Maritime Administration; or
- 17 (D) another federal or state agency responsible
- 18 for domestic security; or
- 19 (5) to respond to an emergency related to (A) supply
- 20 chain disruptions or shortages or (B) other disruptions or
- 21 stoppages of the operations of the district, which does not permit
- 22 the delay incident to the competitive process, or undue cost,
- 23 without harm to the welfare of the district.
- SECTION 3. Section 60.412(a), Water Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (a) A contract for a purchase is exempt from the competitive
- 27 bidding requirements and proposal procedures of this subchapter and

- 1 Subchapter O if a contract is for the purchase of:
- 2 (1) an item that must be purchased in a case of public
- 3 calamity if it is necessary to make the purchase promptly to relieve
- 4 the necessity of the citizens or to preserve the property of the
- 5 district or port authority;
- 6 (2) an item necessary to preserve or protect the
- 7 public health or the safety of the residents of the district or port
- 8 authority;
- 9 (3) an item made necessary by unforeseen damage to the
- 10 property of the district or port authority;
- 11 (4) a personal or professional service;
- 12 (5) any work performed and paid for by the day as the
- 13 work progresses;
- 14 (6) any land or right-of-way;
- 15 (7) an item that can be obtained only from one source,
- 16 including:
- 17 (A) items for which competition is precluded
- 18 because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes,
- 19 or natural monopolies;
- 20 (B) films, manuscripts, or books;
- 21 (C) public utility services; and
- (D) captive replacement parts or components for
- 23 equipment;
- 24 (8) any item necessary to secure a district or port
- 25 authority during a period of heightened security as determined by:
- 26 (A) the federal Department of Homeland Security,
- 27 including the Transportation Security Administration;

- 1 (B) the United States Coast Guard;
- 2 (C) the United States Bureau of Customs and
- 3 Border Protection;
- 4 (D) the Federal Bureau of Investigation;
- 5 (E) the federal Department of Transportation,
- 6 including the Maritime Administration; or
- 7 (F) another federal, state, or local agency; [or]
- 8 (9) an item from the United States, including any
- 9 agency thereof, or from this state, including an agency of this
- 10 state; or
- 11 (10) to respond to an emergency related to (A) supply
- 12 chain disruptions or shortages or (B) other disruptions or
- 13 stoppages of the operations of the district, which does not permit
- 14 the delay incident to the competitive process, or undue cost,
- 15 without harm to the welfare of the district.
- SECTION 4. Subchapter Q, Chapter 60, Water Code, is amended
- 17 by adding Sections 60.503 and 60.504 to read as follows:
- 18 Sec. 60.503. COMMUNITY PROGRAMS. (a) In this section:
- 19 (1) "Historically underutilized business" has the
- 20 meaning assigned by Section 2161.001, Government Code.
- 21 (2) "Local business" means a business concern with a
- 22 principal place of business in the local area of a district, as
- 23 determined by the port commission.
- 24 (3) "Small business" has the meaning assigned by
- 25 <u>Section 5.135(g).</u>
- 26 (b) To stimulate business and commercial activity within a
- 27 district, a district may develop and administer a program to:

- 1 (1) develop small businesses or historically
- 2 underutilized businesses;
- 3 (2) promote or advertise the district; or
- 4 (3) improve the extent to which local businesses,
- 5 small businesses, and other historically underutilized businesses
- 6 are awarded district contracts.
- 7 (c) To develop or administer a program under this section, a
- 8 <u>district may:</u>
- 9 <u>(1) contract with another entity;</u>
- 10 (2) use district funds or employees; and
- 11 (3) accept contributions, gifts, or other resources.
- 12 (d) A program established under this section may set
- 13 contract percentage goals for participation by local businesses,
- 14 small businesses, and historically underutilized businesses in
- 15 public contract awards by the district.
- Sec. 60.504. RIGHT TO REJECT ALL BIDS. A district that
- 17 requests bids or proposals under any of the methods provided by this
- 18 chapter may reject any and all bids or proposals submitted.
- 19 SECTION 5. Section 62.106(e), Water Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- (e) A district created under this chapter may elect to take
- 22 advantage of the condemnation procedure provided in Chapter 21,
- 23 Property Code [Subchapter F of Chapter 51 of this code].
- SECTION 6. Section 62.120(a), Water Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (a) A district may enter into operating contracts and leases
- 27 with cities and other governmental subdivisions for the operation

- 1 of the portions of the district's water system which are designated
- 2 by the board or the commission.
- 3 SECTION 7. Section 62.122, Water Code, is amended to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 Sec. 62.122. DISPOSITION OF SALVAGE OR SURPLUS PERSONAL
- 6 PROPERTY. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), the
- 7 commission or board of trustees under Chapter 54, Transportation
- 8 Code, may periodically dispose of surplus or salvage personal
- 9 property in the same manner as the commissioners court of a county
- 10 under Subchapter D, Chapter 263, Local Government Code.
- 11 (b) The commission or board of trustees under Chapter 54,
- 12 <u>Transportation Code</u>, may authorize:
- 13 (1) the destruction or disposition of salvage or
- 14 surplus property as worthless if the property is so worn, damaged,
- 15 or obsolete that it has no value for the purpose for which it was
- 16 originally intended, and the expense to the district to attempt to
- 17 sell the property would be more than the proceeds from the sale; and
- 18 (2) the sale of its dredge material from a dredge
- 19 material placement area to any person on such terms and conditions
- 20 as the commission or board of trustees considers appropriate or
- 21 advantageous to the district, following any required action by the
- 22 <u>U.S. Army Corps of Engineers</u>.
- 23 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
