- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 56.101(2), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (2) "College" means a college of veterinary medicine
- 7 [located in this state and] accredited by the American Veterinary
- 8 Medical Association Council on Education.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 56.104, Education Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 56.104. ELIGIBLE VETERINARY STUDENT OR GRADUATE. A
- 12 [(a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a] person is eligible to
- 13 participate in the program only if the person:
- 14 (1) is enrolled as a student of a [the] college or
- 15 applies to participate in the program on or before the fourth
- 16 anniversary of the date the person graduates from a [the] college;
- 17 (2) will receive or has received from a student loan at
- 18 least 50 percent of the funds for tuition and fees for one or more
- 19 academic years while enrolled in the college; and
- 20 (3) meets any additional qualifications adopted by the
- 21 committee.
- 22 [(b) A person enrolled as a student in an accredited college
- 23 of veterinary medicine located outside of this state may apply
- 24 under Subsection (a) to participate in the program if the student

- 1 graduated from a high school located in this state or a general
- 2 academic teaching institution located in this state.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 56.105(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (b) To participate as a sponsor in the program, the
- 6 community or political subdivision must enter into an agreement
- 7 with the eligible participant to provide financial support to the
- 8 eligible participant in an amount not less than the tuition and fees
- 9 required for a full academic year for a student enrolled in a [the]
- 10 college in exchange for the eligible participant's agreement to
- 11 practice veterinary medicine in the sponsoring community or
- 12 political subdivision.
- SECTION 4. Sections 56.106(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) To participate in the program, an eligible participant
- 16 must enter into an agreement with the Texas Higher Education
- 17 Coordinating Board [university system] that:
- 18 (1) requires the participant to practice veterinary
- 19 medicine in a rural county for one calendar year for each academic
- 20 year for which the participant receives financial support under the
- 21 program;
- 22 (2) specifies the conditions the participant must
- 23 satisfy to receive financial support under the program;
- 24 (3) provides that any financial support the
- 25 participant receives under the program constitutes a loan until the
- 26 participant satisfies the conditions of the agreement; and
- 27 (4) requires the participant to sign a promissory note

- 1 acknowledging the conditional nature of the financial support
- 2 received under the program and promising to repay the amount of the
- 3 financial support, any applicable interest, and reasonable
- 4 collection costs if the participant does not satisfy the conditions
- 5 of the agreement.
- 6 (b) The financial support received by an eligible
- 7 participant under this subchapter must be used to retire student
- 8 loan debt or to pay tuition and fees to a college [the university
- 9 system] while the eligible participant is enrolled in the college.
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
