A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the state compression percentage and a school district's maximum compressed tax rate under the public school 3 4 finance system. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 48.255(b), Education Code, is amended to 7 read as follows: 8 (b) The state compression percentage is the lower of: 9 (1) 93 percent, or a lower percentage set by 10 appropriation for a school year; 11 (2) the percentage determined by the following 12 formula: 13 SCP = PYCP X 1.01  $[\frac{1.025}{1.025}]/(1 + ECPV)$ ; or 14 (3) the percentage determined under this section for 15 the preceding school year. SECTION 2. Section 48.2551(b), Education Code, is amended 16 to read as follows: 17 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a district's 18 maximum compressed rate ("MCR") is the lesser of: 19 20 (1) the rate determined by the following applicable 21 formula: 22 (A) if "DPV" exceeds "PYDPV" by an amount equal 23 to or greater than <u>one</u> [2.5] percent: MCR = (1.01 [1.025]((PYDPV+E) X PYMCR))/DPV; or 24

No. 1704 1 (B) if Paragraph (A) does not apply: MCR = PYMCR; or 2 3 (2) the product of the state compression percentage, 4 as determined under Section 48.255, for the current tax year, multiplied by \$1.00. 5 6 SECTION 3. Section 48.2552(b), Education Code, is amended 7 to read as follows: If a school district's maximum compressed rate as 8 (b) calculated under Section 48.2551(b) would be less than 60 [90] 9 percent of another school district's maximum compressed rate, the 10 district's maximum compressed rate is the value at which the 11 district's maximum compressed rate would be equal to 60 [90] 12 percent of the other district's maximum compressed rate. 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 14
