- 6 SECTION 1. Article 42A.652(f), Code of Criminal Procedure,

- 9 under this article in the account described by Section
- 10 76.009(a-1)(1)(A), Government Code [special fund of the county
- 11 treasury], to be used for the same purposes for which state aid may

- SECTION 2. Section 76.004(c), Government Code, is amended

- 15 (c) The judges described by Section 76.002 may appoint for
- 16 the department a fiscal officer, other than the county
- 17 auditor. The fiscal officer is responsible for:
- 18 (1) managing and protecting funds, fees, state aid,
- 19 and receipts to the same extent that a county auditor manages county
- 20 funds and funds of other local entities;
- 21 (2) ensuring that financial transactions of the

- 23 (3) prescribing accounting procedures for the
- 24 department; and

- 1 (4) preventing the commingling of funds, fees, and

- 3 SECTION 3. Section 76.009, Government Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) to read as follows:
- 5 (a-1) The department shall:
- 6 (1) maintain at least two separate accounts in the

- 8 509.011(c), of which:
- 9 (A) one account must be used for the deposit of
- 10 <u>all local fees collected</u>, including reimbursement fees and program
- 11 participant fees; and
- 12 (B) one account must be used for the deposit of
- 13 state aid received from the division;
- 14 (2) prescribe accounting procedures to prevent the
- 15 commingling of funds, fees, and state aid; and
- 16 (3) not later than the 90th day after the last day of a
- 17 state fiscal biennium, transfer any unexpended and unencumbered
- 18 state aid received by the department for that biennium to the
- 19 division.
- 20 (a-2) The division shall transfer money received from the
- 21 department under Subsection (a-1)(3) to the state treasury.
- SECTION 4. Section 76.015(b), Government Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- (b) A department that collects a reimbursement fee [money]
- 25 under this section shall deposit the fee in the account described by
- 26 Section 76.009(a-1)(1)(A), to be used for the same purposes for
- 27 which state aid may be used under this chapter [promptly transfer
