A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the maximum allowable cost of certain items eligible
- 3 for a sales tax exemption for a limited period.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 151.326(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (a) The sale of an article of clothing or footwear designed
- 8 to be worn on or about the human body is exempted from the taxes
- 9 imposed by this chapter if:
- 10 (1) the sales price of the article is less than \$175
- 11 [\$100]; and
- 12 (2) the sale takes place during a period beginning at
- 13 12:01 a.m. on the Friday before the 15th day preceding the uniform
- 14 date prescribed by Section 25.0811(a), Education Code, without
- 15 regard to any exception authorized by that section, before which a
- 16 school district may not begin instruction for the school year, and
- 17 ending at 12 midnight on the following Sunday.
- SECTION 2. Section 151.327(a-1), Tax Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- 20 (a-1) The sale or storage, use, or other consumption of a
- 21 school supply or a school backpack is exempted from the taxes
- 22 imposed by this chapter if the school supply or backpack is
- 23 purchased:
- 24 (1) for use by a student in a public or private

- 1 elementary or secondary school;
- 2 (2) during the period described by Section
- 3 151.326(a)(2); and
- 4 (3) for a sales price of less than \$175 [\$100].
- 5 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act does not
- 6 affect tax liability accruing before the effective date of this
- 7 Act. That liability continues in effect as if this Act had not been
- 8 enacted, and the former law is continued in effect for the
- 9 collection of taxes due and for civil and criminal enforcement of
- 10 the liability for those taxes.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
