- 2 relating to conditions imposed on an emergency services district
- 3 that includes territory in the extraterritorial jurisdiction of
- 4 certain municipalities.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 775.014(i), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (i) If a [A] request [submitted] under this section is
- 9 submitted to a municipality that has a population of more than one
- 10 million and the majority of the territory inside the municipality's
- 11 corporate boundaries is located inside a county with a population
- 12 of less than 2.1 million, the request [described by Subsection (h)]
- 13 must include:
- 14 (1) a copy of the petition submitted under Section
- 15 775.015; and
- 16 (2) a sufficient legal description of the portion of
- 17 the municipality and its extraterritorial jurisdiction that would
- 18 be included in the district territory.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 775.016(c), Health and Safety Code, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 (c) The commissioners court has exclusive jurisdiction to
- 22 determine each issue relating to the creation of the district[$_{7}$
- 23 including any matters negotiated with a consenting municipality
- 24 under Section 775.014(h), and may issue incidental orders it

- 1 considers proper in relation to the issues before the commissioners
- 2 court. The commissioners court may adjourn the hearing as
- 3 necessary.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 775.017(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) If after the hearing the commissioners court finds that
- 7 creation of the district is feasible and will promote the public
- 8 safety, welfare, health, and convenience of persons residing in the
- 9 proposed district, the commissioners court shall grant the petition
- 10 and $[\tau]$ fix the district's boundaries $[\tau]$ and impose any conditions
- 11 negotiated under Section 775.014(h)]. If the proposed district,
- 12 according to its boundaries stated in the petition, is located
- 13 wholly in a county with a population of more than 3.3 million, the
- 14 commissioners court may amend the petition to change the boundaries
- 15 of the proposed district if the commissioners court finds the
- 16 change is necessary or desirable. For the purposes of this
- 17 provision, the population of the county is determined according to
- 18 the most recent federal decennial census available at the time the
- 19 petition is filed.
- SECTION 4. Section 775.018(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) On the granting of a petition, the commissioners court
- 23 shall order an election to confirm the district's creation and
- 24 authorize the imposition of a tax not to exceed the rate allowed by
- 25 Section 48-e, Article III, Texas Constitution. [Any conditions
- 26 negotiated under Section 775.014(h) must be included on the
- 27 ballot.]

- 1 SECTION 5. Section 775.019(b), Health and Safety Code, is 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 (b) A district may not include territory in a municipality's
- 4 limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction unless a majority of the
- 5 voters residing in that territory who vote at the election vote in
- 6 favor of creating the district [subject to any conditions
- 7 negotiated under Section 775.014(h) and imposing a tax. The
- 8 exclusion of that territory does not affect the creation of a
- 9 district that includes the remainder of the proposed territory if
- 10 the commissioners court's findings under Section 775.017 are
- 11 favorable to the district's creation.
- 12 SECTION 6. Section 775.022(g), Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (g) The amount of compensation under Subsection (c) shall be
- 15 determined under Subsection (e) regardless of whether Subsection
- 16 (e-1) would yield a greater amount if:
- 17 (1) the municipality <u>has a population of more than one</u>
- 18 million and the majority of the territory inside the municipality's
- 19 corporate boundaries is located inside a county with a population
- 20 of less than 2.1 million [is a municipality described by Section
- 21 $\frac{775.014(h)}{1}$; and
- 22 (2) the municipality and the district enter into an
- 23 agreement on or before September 1, 2019, regarding the district's
- 24 bonded and other indebtedness.
- 25 SECTION 7. The following sections of the Health and Safety
- 26 Code are repealed:
- 27 (1) Section 775.014(h);

- 1 (2) Section 775.019(f); and
- 2 (3) Section 775.031(e).
- SECTION 8. Any conditions that were negotiated by the governing body of a municipality and the commissioners court of a county under Section 775.014(h), Health and Safety Code, as that section existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, are terminated and have no effect.
- SECTION 9. The changes in law made by this Act do not affect 9 the validity or enforceability of a contract that was entered into 10 by the board of emergency services commissioners of an emergency 11 services district before the effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect March 1, 2024.
