S.B. No. 1841

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to family violence center services for victims of family 2 3 violence. Δ BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 51.002, Human Resources Code, is amended 5 6 by amending Subdivisions (1), (2), and (9) and adding Subdivisions (1-a), (1-b), and (8-a) to read as follows: 7 "Dating relationship" has the meaning assigned by 8 (1)Section 71.0021(b), Family Code. 9 10 (1-a) "Dating violence" means an act, other than a defensive measure to protect oneself, by an individual against 11 another individual with whom the actor has or has had a dating 12 relationship and that is: 13 14 (A) intended to result in physical harm, bodily 15 injury, assault, or sexual assault; (B) a threat that reasonably places an individual 16 17 in fear of imminent physical harm, bodily injury, assault, or 18 sexual assault; or 19 (C) intended to inflict emotional harm, including an act of emotional abuse. 20 (1-b) "Family" has the meaning assigned by Section 21 22 71.003, Family Code. "Family violence" means: (2) 23 24 (A) an act by a member of a family or household

against another member of the family or household that: 1 2 (i) [(A)] is intended to result in physical harm, bodily injury, assault, or sexual assault or that is a threat 3 that reasonably places the member in fear of imminent physical 4 harm, bodily injury, <u>assault</u>, or <u>sexual</u> assault, but does not 5 include defensive measures to protect oneself; or 6 7 (ii) [(B)] is intended to inflict emotional harm, including an act of emotional abuse; or 8 9 (B) dating violence. 10 "Trauma-informed" in regard to a service or (8**-**a) 11 service model means that the service or service model is provided in a manner that recognizes and responds to the signs and symptoms of 12 13 trauma in, and the risks of trauma to, a victim of family violence to better support the victim and promote the victim's choice, 14 trust, dignity, connection, and healing. 15 16 (9) "Victim of family violence" means: 17 an adult member of a family or household who (A) is subjected to an act of family violence; [or] 18 (B) a member of the household of the adult 19 20 described by Paragraph (A), other than the member of the household who commits the act of family violence, including an act of 21 emotional abuse; or 22 23 (C) an individual who is subjected to an act of 24 dating violence. 25 SECTION 2. Sections 51.004(a) and (b), Human Resources 26 Code, are amended to read as follows: 27 (a) To be eligible for a contract under Section 51.003(a), a

1 family violence shelter center must:

2 (1) provide temporary lodging and direct delivery of
3 services for adults and their dependents;

4 (2) have been in actual operation offering shelter
5 services 24 hours a day with a capacity for not less than five
6 persons for at least one year before the date on which the contract
7 is awarded;

8 (3) demonstrate that the center, through the services 9 it provides, is addressing a need in the community consistent with 10 the plan for family violence services under Section 51.0021; [and]

11 (4) <u>demonstrate that the center is using a voluntary</u>
12 <u>and trauma-informed advocacy service model that respects an</u>
13 individual's needs; and

14 (5) submit a contract application on forms prescribed 15 by the commission.

16 (b) To be eligible for a contract under Section 51.003(a), a17 family violence nonresidential center must:

18 (1) provide, as its primary purpose, direct delivery
19 of services to adult victims of family violence;

20 (2) demonstrate a system of referring victims of
21 family violence to at least one family violence shelter center or
22 other safe temporary lodging;

(3) have been operating and providing comprehensive services, including the services described by Section 51.005(b)(3), to victims of family violence for at least one year before the date on which the contract is awarded;

27 (4) demonstrate that the center, through the services

it provides, is addressing a need in the community consistent with 1 2 the plan for family violence services under Section 51.0021; [and] (5) demonstrate that the center is using a voluntary 3 and trauma-informed advocacy service model that respects an 4 individual's needs; and 5 6 (6) submit a contract application on forms prescribed 7 by the commission. SECTION 3. Section 51.005, Human Resources Code, is amended 8 9 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows: 10 11 (b) The contracts shall require the persons operating a family violence center to: 12 13 (1)make a quarterly and an annual financial report on 14 a form prescribed by the commission; 15 (2) cooperate with inspections the commission makes to 16 ensure services standards and fiscal responsibility; and (3) provide, as its primary purpose, voluntary and 17 trauma-informed services to victims of family violence that 18 include: 19 24-hour-a-day shelter, except that a family 20 (A) nonresidential center may provide 21 violence access to а 24-hour-a-day shelter; 22 a 24-hour-a-day crisis hotline, except that a 23 (B) 24 family violence nonresidential center may provide access to a 25 24-hour-a-day crisis hotline operated by another organization located in the nonresidential center's service area; 26 27 (C) access to emergency medical care;

1 (D) crisis and intervention services, including 2 [safety planning,] understanding and support, information, education, referrals, and other resource assistance; 3 4 (E) access to emergency transportation; advocacy focused on: 5 (F) (i) economic and housing stability; 6 7 (ii) physical, behavioral, and mental 8 health; 9 (iii) the needs of children who are victims and the children of victims; and 10 (iv) [legal assistance in] the civil and 11 criminal legal [justice] systems, including: 12 13 (a)[(i)] identifying individual needs, legal rights, and legal options; and 14 15 (b)[(ii)] providing support and 16 accompaniment in pursuing those options; 17 (G) ongoing safety planning services in collaboration with the self-stated priorities and needs of the 18 victim of family violence [information about educational 19 20 arrangements for children]; community education regarding family 21 (H) violence and family violence prevention efforts [information about 22 training for and seeking employment]; 23 counseling services 24 (I) [cooperation with 25 criminal justice officials]; and peer support services led by victims of 26 (J) 27 family violence, including activities and other efforts that

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1	facilitate connections and the creation of community among victims
2	of family violence [community education;
3	[(K) a referral system to existing community
4	services; and
5	[(L) a volunteer recruitment and training
6	program].
7	(b-1) The contracts shall:
8	(1) specify that participation in services by a victim
9	of family violence is voluntary; and
10	(2) prohibit the persons operating a family violence
11	center from requiring a victim of family violence to participate in
12	other services as a condition of receiving shelter.
13	SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
14	a contract entered into or amended on or after the effective date of
15	this Act. A contract entered into or amended before the effective
16	date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
17	contract was entered into or amended, and the former law is
18	continued in effect for that purpose.
19	SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2024.
