S.B. No. 1967

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT relating to compensation and leave for certain employees of the 2 3 office of inspector general of the Texas Juvenile Justice 4 Department. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 659.301(5), Government Code, is amended 7 to read as follows: 8 (5) "State employee" means an individual who: (A) is a commissioned law enforcement officer of 9 10 the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Facilities Commission, the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, the Texas Department of 11 12 Criminal Justice, the attorney general, [or] the insurance fraud 13 unit of the Texas Department of Insurance, or the office of inspector general of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; 14 15 (B) is a commissioned security officer of the 16 comptroller; (C) is a law enforcement officer commissioned by 17 the Parks and Wildlife Commission; 18 19 (D) is a commissioned peace officer of an institution of higher education; 20 21 (E) is an employee or official of the Board of 22 Pardons and Paroles or the parole division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice if the employee or official has routine direct 23 24 contact with inmates of any penal or correctional institution or

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with administratively released prisoners subject to the board's 1 2 jurisdiction;

(F) has been certified the 3 to Employees Retirement System of Texas under Section 815.505 as having begun 4 employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial officer, 5 unless the individual has been certified to the system as having 6 7 ceased employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial officer; 8

before May 29, 1987, received hazardous duty 9 (G) pay based on the terms of any state law if the individual holds a 10 11 position designated under that law as eligible for the pay; or

is a security officer employed by the Texas 12 (H) 13 Military Department.

SECTION 2. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, is amended 14 15 to read as follows:

16 (a) This section applies to a peace officer under Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, who is commissioned as a law 17 enforcement officer or agent, including a ranger, by: 18

(1)the Public Safety Commission and the director of 19 the Department of Public Safety; 20

the Parks and Wildlife Commission; 21 (2) 22 (3) the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission; the attorney general; [or] 23 (4) 24 (5) the insurance fraud unit of the Texas Department 25 of Insurance; or

(6) the office of inspector general of the Texas 26 27 Juvenile Justice Department.

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SECTION 3. Section 242.102, Human Resources Code, is
amended by adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:

3 <u>(j) The department shall ensure that a peace officer</u> 4 <u>commissioned under Subsection (d) is compensated according to</u> 5 <u>Schedule C of the position classification salary schedule</u> 6 <u>prescribed by the General Appropriations Act.</u>

7 SECTION 4. (a) The classification officer in the office of 8 the state auditor shall classify the position of commissioned peace 9 officer employed by the office of inspector general of the Texas 10 Juvenile Justice Department as a Schedule C position under the 11 Texas Position Classification Plan.

12 (b) The change made by the classification officer as 13 required by this section applies beginning with the state fiscal 14 biennium beginning September 1, 2023.

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(c) This section expires September 1, 2025.

16 SECTION 5. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, as amended 17 by this Act, applies only to an injury that occurs on or after the 18 effective date of this Act.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
