4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 37.0818 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 37.0818. PAROCHIAL SCHOOL PEACE OFFICERS. (a) In this
8	section, "parochial school" means a private school that is operated
9	by a religious organization and provides students with religious
10	instruction as part of the school's curriculum.
11	(b) This section applies only to a parochial school that is:
12	(1) located in a county with a population of 3.3
13	million or more; and
14	(2) operated by a religious organization with at least
15	50,000 members.
16	(c) The governing body of a parochial school to which this
17	section applies may commission peace officers to enforce state and
18	local law on a campus of the school.
19	(d) The duties of a peace officer commissioned by a
20	parochial school under this section shall include protecting:
21	(1) the safety and welfare of any person in the
22	jurisdiction of the officer; and
23	(2) the property of the school.
24	(e) A peace officer commissioned by a parochial school under

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this section must meet all minimum standards for peace officers 1 established by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement. 2 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, SECTION 2. 3 is amended to read as follows: 4 5 Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace 6 officers: sheriffs, their deputies, 7 (1)and those reserve 8 deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; 9 (2) constables, deputy constables, and those reserve 10 deputy constables who hold a permanent peace officer license issued 11 12 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code; (3) marshals or police officers of an incorporated 13 14 city, town, or village, and those reserve municipal police officers who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter 15 1701, Occupations Code; 16 17 (4) rangers, officers, and members of the reserve officer corps commissioned by the Public Safety Commission and the 18 Director of the Department of Public Safety; 19 investigators of the district attorneys', criminal 20 (5) district attorneys', and county attorneys' offices; 21 law enforcement agents of the Texas Alcoholic 22 (6) 23 Beverage Commission; 24 (7)each member of an arson investigating unit 25 commissioned by a city, a county, or the state; 26 (8) officers commissioned under Section 37.081 or 27 37.0818, Education Code, or Subchapter E, Chapter 51, Education

4 (29) investigators commissioned by the Texas
5 Commission on Law Enforcement under Section 1701.160, Occupations
6 Code;

7 (30) commission investigators commissioned by the 8 Texas Private Security Board under Section 1702.061, Occupations 9 Code;

10 (31) the fire marshal and any officers, inspectors, or 11 investigators commissioned by an emergency services district under 12 Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code;

13 (32) officers commissioned by the State Board of 14 Dental Examiners under Section 254.013, Occupations Code, subject 15 to the limitations imposed by that section;

16 (33) investigators commissioned by the Texas Juvenile 17 Justice Department as officers under Section 221.011, Human 18 Resources Code; and

(34) the fire marshal and any related officers,
inspectors, or investigators commissioned by a county under
Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Local Government Code.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
