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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to access to and the security of certain critical 3 infrastructure.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 113.001, Business & Commerce Code, as 6 added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 7 Regular Session, 2021, is amended by adding Subdivision (5) to read 8 as follows:

9 <u>(5)</u> "Affiliate," with respect to a company entering 10 into an agreement in which the critical infrastructure is electric 11 grid equipment, has the meaning assigned by the February 1, 2023, 12 version of the ERCOT Nodal Protocols.

SECTION 2. Section 113.002, Business & Commerce Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, is amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:

17 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a business entity may 18 enter into an agreement described by Subsection (a)(1) in which the 19 critical infrastructure is electric grid equipment if the business 20 entity takes reasonable and necessary actions to ensure that remote 21 access or control by the company is mitigated.

22 SECTION 3. Subchapter F, Chapter 411, Government Code, is 23 amended by adding Section 411.1183 to read as follows:

24 Sec. 411.1183. ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD

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1 INFORMATION: INDEPENDENT ORGANIZATION CERTIFIED UNDER UTILITIES CODE. 2 (a) An independent organization certified under Section 39.151, Utilities Code, for security reasons is entitled to obtain 3 from the department criminal history record information maintained 4 by the department that relates to a person who has or is seeking 5 employment at or access to the independent organization's systems 6 that affect the security of the electric grid. 7 (b) Criminal history information obtained from 8 the department may not be released or disclosed except: 9 10 (1) as needed in protecting the security of the electric grid; 11 12 (2) as authorized by a court order or a federal or 13 state law or order; or 14 (3) with the consent of the person who is the subject 15 of the criminal history record information. SECTION 4. Section 2274.0101, Government Code, as added by 16 17 Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, is amended by amending Subdivision (5) and adding 18 Subdivision (6) to read as follows: 19 "Governmental entity" means a state agency, a [or] 20 (5) political subdivision, or an independent organization certified 21 under Section 39.151, Utilities Code, to perform a function 22 described by Section 39.151(a), Utilities Code [of this state]. 23 24 (6) "Affiliate," with respect to a company entering into an agreement in which the critical infrastructure is electric 25 26 grid equipment, has the meaning assigned by the February 1, 2023, version of the ERCOT Nodal Protocols.

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SECTION 5. Section 39.151, Utilities Code, is amended by 1 2 adding Subsection (g-7) to read as follows: 3 (g-7) To maintain certification as an independent organization under this section, the organization must: 4 5 (1) identify all employee positions in the organization that are critical to the security of the electric 6 grid; and 7 (2) before hiring a person for a position described by 8 Subdivision (1), obtain from the Department of Public Safety or a 9 10 private vendor all criminal history record information relating to the prospective employee. 11 12 SECTION 6. Subchapter H, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is 13 amended by adding Section 39.360 to read as follows: 14 Sec. 39.360. TRANSACTIONS WITH CERTAIN FOREIGN-OWNED 15 COMPANIES IN CONNECTION WITH CRITICAL INFRASTRUCTURE. (a) In this section, "company" and "critical infrastructure" have the meanings 16 17 assigned by Section 113.001, Business & Commerce Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular 18 19 Session, 2021. (b) An independent organization certified under Section 20 39.151 may not register a business entity to operate in the power 21 region for which the independent organization is certified unless 22 23 the business entity: 24 (1) attests that the entity complies with Chapter 113, Business & Commerce Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts 25 26 of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, including by taking reasonable and necessary actions to mitigate remote access to or 27

No. 2013 1 control of the entity's electric grid equipment by a company described by Section 113.002(a)(2), Business & Commerce Code, as 2 added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 3 Regular Session, 2021; 4 5 (2) takes reasonable and necessary actions to mitigate remote access to or control of the entity's electric grid equipment 6 7 by a country designated under Section 113.003, Business & Commerce Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th 8 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021; and 9 10 (3) attests that the entity complies with Subdivision (2). 11 12 (c) An independent organization certified under Section 39.151 shall require as a condition of operating in the region that 13 14 a business entity: 15 (1) report to the independent organization the purchase of any critical electric grid equipment from a company 16 17 described by Section 113.002(a)(2), Business & Commerce Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 18 19 Regular Session, 2021; and (2) take reasonable and necessary actions to mitigate 20 access to or control of the purchased critical electric grid 21 equipment by a company described by Section 113.002(a)(2), Business 22 & Commerce Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 23 24 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021. (d) Notwithstanding any other law, an 25 independent 26 organization certified under Section 39.151 may immediately suspend or terminate a company's registration or access to any of 27

the independent organization's systems if the independent 1 2 organization has a reasonable suspicion that the company meets any of the criteria described by Section 2274.0102(a)(2), Government 3 Code, as added by Chapter 975 (S.B. 2116), Acts of the 87th 4 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021. 5 6 (e) A contractual provision that limits or contradicts 7 Subsection (d) is contrary to public policy and is unenforceable and <u>vo</u>id. 8 9 (f) An independent organization certified under Section 10 39.151 may adopt guidelines or procedures relating to the suspension or termination of a company's registration or access to 11 12 any of the independent organization's systems. (g) The commission shall: 13 14 (1) adopt any rules necessary to administer this 15 section or authorize an independent organization to carry out a 16 duty imposed by this section; and 17 (2) by rule establish a process to allow a company that has been adversely affected by a suspension or termination under 18 19 Subsection (d) to request that the commission review and approve or deny the suspension or termination. 20

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21 SECTION 7. The changes made to Chapter 113, Business & 22 Commerce Code, and Chapter 2274, Government Code, apply only to a 23 contract or agreement entered into on or after the effective date of 24 this Act.

25 SECTION 8. It is the intent of the 88th Legislature, Regular 26 Session, 2023, that the amendments made by this Act be harmonized 27 with another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023,

1 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted 2 codes.

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3 SECTION 9. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
