3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 21, Transportation Code,
5	is amended by adding Section 21.0045 to read as follows:
6	Sec. 21.0045. ADVANCED AIR MOBILITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE.
7	(a) In this section, "advanced air mobility" has the meaning
8	assigned by Section 21.072.
9	(b) The commission shall appoint an advisory committee to
10	assess current state law and any potential changes to state law that
11	are needed to facilitate the implementation of advanced air
12	mobility technology in this state.
13	(c) The commission shall appoint to the advisory committee
14	members to represent:
15	(1) diverse geographic regions of the state;
16	(2) state and local law enforcement;
17	(3) the advanced air mobility industry;
18	(4) transportation experts;
19	(5) commercial airport representatives;
20	(6) vertical takeoff and landing operators and
21	vertiport operators;
22	(7) local governments; and
23	(8) the general public.
24	(d) The advisory committee shall:

1	(1) hold public hearings in locations across the state
2	or via electronic means; and
3	(2) receive comments through an Internet website, by
4	mail, and by other methods, if appropriate.
5	(e) Not later than November 1, 2024, the advisory committee
6	shall submit to the commission and the legislature a written report
7	that includes the committee's findings and recommendations on any
8	changes to state law that are needed to facilitate the
9	implementation of advanced air mobility technology in this state.
10	(f) The advisory committee is abolished and this section
11	expires January 1, 2025.
12	SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Transportation Code,
13	is amended by adding Section 21.072 to read as follows:
14	Sec. 21.072. ADVANCED AIR MOBILITY. (a) In this section,
15	"advanced air mobility" means an aviation transportation system
16	that uses highly automated aircraft, which may be manned or
17	unmanned, to operate and transport passengers or cargo at lower
18	altitudes for commercial, public service, private, or recreational
19	purposes.
20	(b) The department shall:
21	(1) review existing state aviation standards and
22	guidelines, airport facility planning, and compatibility guidance
23	to ensure that the standards, guidelines, planning, and guidance
24	are applicable to advanced air mobility;
25	(2) support the development of federal and industry
26	standards for advanced air mobility technology that prioritize
27	safety as the technology develops;

1 (3) designate a department employee as a liaison to 2 the Federal Aviation Administration for purposes of Subdivision 3 (2); 4 (4) develop a statewide plan, or an update to the Texas Airport System Plan, that specifies potential locations for and 5 classifications of vertiports and other associated infrastructure 6 7 to guide the future operational environment of advanced air mobility; and 8 9 (5) provide resources and assistance on the use of advanced air mobility technology and infrastructure to local 10 governments, regional councils of government, transportation 11 planning organizations, the advanced air mobility industry, and 12 13 other entities for the purpose of identifying governmental methods to integrate industry innovation and community vision and help 14 promote advanced air mobility technology. 15 16 (c) The department, Texas Education Agency, Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and Texas State Technical College 17 System shall jointly collaborate with school districts, 18 institutions of higher education, and interested public and private 19

20 stakeholders on educational opportunities related to advanced air 21 mobility technology.

SECTION 3. The Texas Department of Transportation, Texas Education Agency, Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and Texas State Technical College System are required to implement Section 21.072, Transportation Code, as added by this Act, only if the legislature appropriates money specifically for that purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money specifically for that

1 purpose, the Texas Department of Transportation, Texas Education 2 Agency, Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and Texas State 3 Technical College System may, but are not required to, implement 4 Section 21.072, Transportation Code, using other appropriations 5 available for that purpose.

SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
