1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to the identification and mapping of aggregate production
1-22 operations by The University of Texas Bureau of Economic Geology.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 67, Education Code, is
1-25 amended by adding Section 67.73 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 67.73. IDENTIFICATION AND MAPPING OF AGGREGATE
1-27 PRODUCTION OPERATIONS. (a) In this section, "aggregate production
1-28 operation" has the meaning assigned by Section 28A.001, Water Code.

1-29 (b) The bureau shall:

1-30 (1) conduct a study to identify:

1-31 (A) locations in this state suitable for
1-32 aggregate production operations; and

1-33 (B) existing land uses or planning policies of
1-34 political subdivisions that could result in a location identified
1-35 under Paragraph (A) becoming incompatible with use as an aggregate
1-36 production operation;

1-37 (2) develop and maintain a database that:

1-38 (A) maps locations identified under Subdivision
1-39 (1)(A) and Section 28A.052, Water Code; and

1-40 (B) is accessible to political subdivisions; and

1-41 (3) update the study and map described by Subdivisions
1-42 (1) and (2) not less than once every 10 years.

1-43 (c) In fulfilling the duties described by Subsection (b),
1-44 the bureau may cooperate with:

1-45 (1) the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, the
1-46 Texas Water Development Board, and any other state agency,
1-47 political subdivision, or university with access to information
1-48 related to aggregate production operations; and

1-49 (2) federal agencies or private entities as
1-50 appropriate to fulfill the requirements of this section.

1-51 (d) An agency, political subdivision, or university
1-52 described by Subsection (c)(1) shall provide to the bureau on
1-53 request available information as necessary to fulfill the
1-54 requirements of this section.

1-55 (e) The bureau may accept gifts, grants, and donations from
1-56 sources other than the state for the purpose of implementing this
1-57 section.

1-58 SECTION 2. Not later than December 1, 2025, The University
1-59 of Texas Bureau of Economic Geology shall submit to the legislature
1-60 a report that contains:
