| 19 | (b) A letter, memorandum, or document relating to alleged |
| 20 | misconduct by the fire fighter or police officer may not be placed |

This subsection does not prohibit a law enforcement 1 agency hiring a police officer from viewing the contents of an 2 investigation file under Section 1701.451, Occupations Code. 3 (i) Notwithstanding <u>Subsection</u> (b), the employing 4 department may disclose information for a law enforcement purpose. 5 (j) A local ordinance, executive order, or rule adopted by a 6 7 political subdivision may not supersede any provision in this 8 section. 9 SECTION 4. Subchapter F, Chapter 143, Local Government Code, is amended by adding Sections 143.091 and 143.092 to read as 10 11 follows: 12 Sec. 143.091. MUTUAL AGREEMENTS CONTROL. A mutual 13 agreement between a public employer and the bargaining agent supersedes a local ordinance, executive order, or rule adopted by a 14 political subdivision. 15 16 Sec. 143.092. ELIGIBILITY FOR SERVICE ON A CIVILIAN OVERSIGHT COMMISSION. A person is not eligible to serve on a 17 civilian oversight commission if the person: 18 (1) has been convicted of or placed on deferred 19 20 adjudication for a felony offense; or (2) has been convicted of a crime of moral turpitude. 21 22 SECTION 5. Section 143.091, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, applies to an agreement that was in effect on January 23 1, 2023. 24 25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 26

27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
