1-21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-22 SECTION 1. Sections [478.0001](#)(3) and (7), Government Code, as
 1-23 effective April 1, 2023, are amended to read as follows:

2-59 SECTION 2. To the extent of any conflict, this Act prevails
 2-60 over another Act of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021,
 2-61 relating to nonsubstantive additions to and corrections in enacted
 2-62 codes.

2-63 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
