A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the minimum number of instructional days provided by
- 3 public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.081, Education Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 Sec. 25.081. OPERATION OF SCHOOLS. (a) Except as
- 8 authorized under Subsection (b) of this section, Section 25.0815,
- 9 Section 25.084, or Section 29.0821, for each school year each
- 10 school district must operate:
- 11 (1) for a minimum of 175 instructional days; and
- 12 (2) for at least 75,600 minutes of operation,
- 13 including time allocated for instruction, intermissions, and
- 14 recesses for students.
- 15 (b) The commissioner may approve the operation of schools
- 16 for fewer than the number of instructional days or minutes of
- 17 operation required under Subsection (a) if disaster, flood, extreme
- 18 weather conditions, fuel curtailment, or another calamity causes
- 19 the closing of schools.
- 20 (c) If the commissioner does not approve reduced
- 21 <u>instructional days or minutes of</u> operation [time] under Subsection
- 22 (b), a school district may add additional <u>instructional days to the</u>
- 23 <u>school year or minutes of operation</u> to the end of the district's
- 24 normal school hours as necessary to compensate for instructional

- 1 days or minutes of operation lost due to school closures caused by
- 2 disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions, fuel curtailment, or
- 3 another calamity.
- 4 (d) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this
- 5 section, including rules:
- 6 (1) [for the application, on the basis of the minimum
- 7 minutes of operation required by Subsection (a), of any provision
- 8 of this title that refers to a minimum number of days of instruction
- 9 under this section:
- 10 $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ to determine the minutes of operation that are
- 11 equivalent to a day;
- (2) $[\frac{3}{3}]$ defining minutes of operation and
- 13 instructional time; and
- (3) $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$ establishing the minimum number of minutes of
- 15 instructional time required for a full-day and a half-day program
- 16 to meet the time requirements under Subsection (a).
- 17 (e) A school district or education program is exempt from
- 18 the minimum required instructional days or minutes of operation
- 19 [requirement] if the district's or program's average daily
- 20 attendance is calculated under Section 48.005(j).
- 21 (f) The commissioner may proportionally reduce the amount
- 22 of funding a district receives under Chapter 46, 48, or 49 and the
- 23 average daily attendance calculation for the district if the
- 24 district operates on a calendar that provides fewer instructional
- 25 days or minutes of operation than required under Subsection (a).
- 26 (g) A school district may not provide student instruction on
- 27 Memorial Day. If a school district would be required to provide

- 1 student instruction on Memorial Day to compensate for instructional
- 2 <u>days or</u> minutes of <u>operation</u> [instruction] lost because of school
- 3 closures caused by disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions,
- 4 fuel curtailment, or another calamity, the commissioner shall
- 5 approve the instruction of students for fewer than the number of
- 6 <u>instructional days or</u> minutes <u>of operation</u> required under
- 7 Subsection (a).
- 8 SECTION 2. Sections 25.0815(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The commissioner shall provide a waiver allowing for
- 11 fewer <u>instructional days and fewer</u> minutes of operation [and
- 12 instructional time] than required under Section 25.081(a) for a
- 13 school district that requires each educator employed by the
- 14 district to attend an approved school safety training course.
- 15 (b) A waiver under this section:
- 16 (1) must allow sufficient time for the school
- 17 district's educators to attend the school safety training course;
- 18 and
- 19 (2) may not:
- 20 (A) result in an inadequate number of minutes of
- 21 instructional time for students; or
- 22 (B) reduce<u>:</u>
- (i) the number of instructional days by
- 24 more than one day; or
- 25 (ii) the number of minutes of operation
- 26 [and instructional time] by more than 420 minutes.
- 27 SECTION 3. Section 29.026(e), Education Code, is amended to

- 1 read as follows:
- 2 (e) A program under this section may:
- 3 (1) alter the length of the school day or school year
- 4 or the number of <u>instructional days or the</u> minutes of <u>operation</u>
- 5 allocated to instruction for [received by] students;
- 6 (2) coordinate services with private or
- 7 community-based providers;
- 8 (3) allow the enrollment of students without
- 9 disabilities or with other disabilities, if approved by the
- 10 commissioner; and
- 11 (4) adopt staff qualifications and staff to student
- 12 ratios that differ from the applicable requirements of this title.
- SECTION 4. Section 29.0822(c), Education Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 (c) Except in the case of a course designed for a student
- 16 described by Subsection (a) (3) or enrolled in a course described by
- 17 Subsection (b) (4), a course offered in a program under this section
- 18 must provide for at least the same number of instructional hours as
- 19 required for a course offered in a program that meets the required
- 20 minimum number of instructional days [minutes of operation] under
- 21 Section 25.081.
- SECTION 5. Section 29.162(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- 24 (a) The commissioner may adopt rules for this subchapter,
- 25 including rules establishing full-day and half-day instructional
- 26 days and minutes of operation requirements as provided by Section
- 27 25.081.

- 1 SECTION 6. Section 37.011(f), Education Code, is amended to 2 read as follows:
- 3 (f) A juvenile justice alternative education program must
- 4 operate at least seven hours per day and 175 [180] days per year,
- 5 except that a program may apply to the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 6 Department for a waiver of the 175-day [180 day] requirement. The
- 7 department may not grant a waiver to a program under this subsection
- 8 for a number of days that exceeds the highest number of
- 9 instructional days waived by the commissioner during the same
- 10 school year for a school district served by the program.
- SECTION 7. Sections 48.005(i), (j), and (m), Education
- 12 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 13 (i) A district or a charter school operating under Chapter
- 14 12 that operates a prekindergarten program is eligible to receive
- 15 one-half of average daily attendance under Subsection (a) if the
- 16 district's or charter school's prekindergarten program provides at
- 17 least 32,400 minutes of instructional time to students over the
- 18 minimum required number of instructional days.
- 19 (j) A district or charter school is eligible to earn full
- 20 average daily attendance under Subsection (a) if the district or
- 21 school provides at least 43,200 minutes of instructional time
- 22 <u>during a school year</u> to students enrolled in:
- 23 (1) a dropout recovery school or program operating
- 24 under Section 12.1141(c) or Section 39.0548;
- 25 (2) an alternative education program operating under
- 26 Section 37.008;
- 27 (3) a school program located at a day treatment

- 1 facility, residential treatment facility, psychiatric hospital, or
- 2 medical hospital;
- 3 (4) a school program offered at a correctional
- 4 facility; or
- 5 (5) a school operating under Subchapter G, Chapter 12.
- 6 (m) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to implement
- 7 this section, including rules that:
- 8 (1) establish the minimum amount of instructional time
- 9 per day that allows a school district or charter school to be
- 10 eligible for full average daily attendance, which may differ based
- 11 on the instructional program offered by the district or charter
- 12 school;
- 13 (2) establish the requirements necessary for a school
- 14 district or charter school to be eligible for one-half of average
- 15 daily attendance, which may differ based on the instructional
- 16 program offered by the district or charter school;
- 17 (3) proportionally reduce the average daily
- 18 attendance for a school district if any campus or instructional
- 19 program in the district provides to students fewer than the
- 20 required minimum <u>number of instructional days or</u> minutes of
- 21 operation [instruction to students]; and
- 22 (4) allow a grade or course repeated under Section
- 23 28.02124 to qualify for average daily attendance even if the
- 24 student previously passed or earned credit for the grade or course,
- 25 if the grade or course would otherwise be eligible.
- SECTION 8. Section 48.0051(a), Education Code, is amended
- 27 to read as follows:

- 1 (a) Subject to Subsection (a-1), the commissioner shall
- 2 adjust the average daily attendance of a school district or
- 3 open-enrollment charter school under Section 48.005 in the manner
- 4 provided by Subsection (b) if the district or school:
- 5 (1) provides the minimum number of minutes of
- 6 operational and instructional time required under Section 25.081
- 7 and commissioner rules adopted under that section over the minimum
- 8 required number of instructional days or minutes of operation [at
- 9 least 180 days of instruction]; and
- 10 (2) offers an additional 30 days of half-day
- 11 instruction for students enrolled in prekindergarten through fifth
- 12 grade.
- SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2024-2025
- 14 school year.
- 15 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
