1 integration of physical health education and mental health 2 education; (B) physical education and physical activity; 3 4 (C) nutrition services; parental involvement; 5 (D) instruction on substance abuse prevention; 6 (E) 7 (F) school health services, including mental health services; 8 9 (G) a comprehensive school counseling program 10 under Section 33.005;

(H) a safe and healthy school environment; and
(I) school employee wellness;

13 (3) appropriate grade levels and methods of14 instruction for human sexuality instruction;

15 (4) strategies for integrating the curriculum 16 components specified by Subdivision (2) with the following elements 17 in a coordinated school health program for the district:

(A) school health services, including physical
health services and mental health services, if provided at a campus

18 (8) appropriate grade levels and curriculum for instruction regarding child abuse, family violence, 19 dating violence, and sex trafficking, including likely warning signs that 20 a child may be at risk for sex trafficking, provided that the local 21 22 school health advisory council's recommendations under this subdivision do not conflict with the essential knowledge and skills 23 developed by the State Board of Education under this subchapter. 24

25 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
