## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the development of a webpage and mobile application for
3	the provision of pregnancy-related resources and information.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 161, Health and Safety Code, is amended
6	by adding Subchapter X to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER X. PREGNANCY-RELATED RESOURCES AND INFORMATION
8	Sec. 161.701. PREGNANCY-RELATED RESOURCES AND INFORMATION
9	WEBPAGE. (a) The Department of Information Resources, in
10	consultation with the commission, shall develop and maintain on the
11	Texas.gov Internet website a publicly accessible webpage of
12	pregnancy-related resources and information, including any
13	available:
14	(1) resources for:
15	(A) mental health counseling, pregnancy
16	counseling, and other prenatal and postpartum services;
17	(B) mentorship opportunities, including
18	pregnancy assistance and case management;
19	(C) health care and well-being services,
20	including services for obstetrical and gynecological support,
21	abortion pill reversal, breastfeeding assistance, health care, and
22	dental care;
23	(D) financial assistance, employment
24	opportunities, nutrition assistance, child care options, and

1	educational opportunities;
2	(E) legal services, including legal services for
3	child support, custody issues, family leave, and breastfeeding
4	<pre>protections;</pre>
5	(F) professional support, including tax
6	<pre>preparation;</pre>
7	(G) financial and housing assistance, including
8	assistance with food, nutrition, clothing, household goods, baby
9	supplies, housing options, shelter options, maternity home
10	options, and crisis pregnancy center options;
11	(H) recovery and mental health services,
12	including services for addiction or suicide intervention,
13	counseling services for victims of intimate partner violence,
14	sexual assault, or sex trafficking, and counseling services for the
15	<pre>unexpected loss of a child;</pre>
16	(I) prenatal diagnostic services, including
17	disability support organizations, newborn medical interventions,
18	and perinatal hospice services;
19	(J) healing and support services for abortion
20	survivors and the survivors' families; and
21	(K) services related to providing care for
22	children, including services for public and private adoption,
23	<pre>foster care, and short-term child care;</pre>
24	(2) information about:
25	(A) alternatives to abortion;
26	(B) abortion risks, including complications and
27	failures;

1	(C) child development beginning at conception;
2	(D) pregnancy wellness;
3	(E) family planning;
4	(F) the Healthy Texas Women program defined by
5	Section 32.151;
6	(G) the Alternatives to Abortion program
7	administered by the commission; and
8	(H) any pregnancy-related services provided by a
9	<pre>county in this state; and</pre>
10	(3) any other resources or information considered
11	helpful to pregnant women.
12	(b) The webpage described by Subsection (a) must:
13	(1) through a series of questions, provide the person
14	accessing the webpage information tailored to the person's answers,
15	including information regarding risks related to abortion at all
16	stages of gestation;
17	(2) allow for webpage users to submit feedback
18	regarding whether the webpage is user-friendly and helpful in
19	providing tailored answers described by Subdivision (1); and
20	(3) include a tool to search for resources described
21	by Subsection (a) by zip code and county.
22	Sec. 161.702. PREGNANCY-RELATED RESOURCES AND INFORMATION
23	MOBILE APPLICATION. The Department of Information Resources, in
24	consultation with the commission, shall develop a mobile
25	application that:
26	(1) provides the resources and information described
27	by Section 161.701(a); and

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- 1 (2) satisfies the requirements described by Section
- 2 <u>161.701(b).</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
