No. 2475 1 presentation<u>;</u> 2 (6) an official Native American identification card or 3 tribal document that: 4 (A) contains the voter's photograph and address; 5 and 6 (B) is issued by a tribal organization or by a 7 tribe that is federally recognized and located in this state; (7) an identification card issued by a public or 8 9 private institution of higher education located in this state that contains the voter's photograph; or 10 11 (8) an identification card issued by a state agency of 12 this state that contains the voter's photograph. SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 17
