A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the bilingual education allotment under the public school finance system. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 29.054, Education Code, is amended by 5 adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: 6 7 (e) Notwithstanding Section 29.066(c), the agency may require, for purposes of implementing Section 48.105, a school 8 9 district that is granted an exception under this section to: (1) include in the district's Public Education 10 Information Management System (PEIMS) report additional 11 12 information specified by the agency and relating to the alternative language education methods used by the district; and 13 14 (2) classify the alternative language education method used by the district under the Public Education Information 15 16 Management System (PEIMS) report as specified by the agency. SECTION 2. Section 48.105, Education Code, is amended by 17 adding Subsections (a-1) and (a-2) and amending Subsection (b) to 18 read as follows: 19 (a-1) The agency shall review school districts that offer 20 21 alternative language methods approved by the agency under Section 29.054(d) and approve districts to receive the allotment under 22 23 Subsection (a-2) for that biennium in a manner that provides not more than \$10 million total under the allotment to school districts 24

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1	in each biennium. In approving school districts to receive the
2	allotment under this subsection, the agency shall, to the extent
3	possible, approve eligible school districts from a cross section of
4	this state.
5	(a-2) For each student in average daily attendance in an
6	alternative language method approved by the agency under Section
7	29.054(d), and offered by a school district approved to receive the
8	allotment under Subsection (a-1), the district is entitled to an
9	annual allotment equal to the basic allotment multiplied by:
10	(1) 0.15 for an emergent bilingual student, as defined
11	by Section 29.052, if the student is in an alternative language
12	method using a dual language immersion/one-way or two-way program
13	model; and
14	(2) 0.05 for a student not described by Subdivision
15	(1), if the student is in an alternative language method using a
16	dual language immersion/one-way or two-way program model.
17	(b) At least 55 percent of the funds allocated under this
18	section must be used in providing bilingual education or special
19	language programs under Subchapter B, Chapter 29. A district's
20	bilingual education or special language allocation may be used only
21	for program and student evaluation, instructional materials and
22	equipment, staff development, supplemental staff expenses, <u>teacher</u>
23	salaries [salary supplements for teachers], incremental costs
24	associated with providing smaller class sizes, and other supplies
25	required for quality instruction.
26	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
