## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to student loan repayment assistance for certain health
3	care workers employed in rural counties.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter L-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER L-1. REPAYMENT OF EDUCATION LOANS FOR RURAL HEALTH CARE
8	WORKERS
9	Sec. 61.671. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Health care worker" means a person who furnishes
11	health care services in direct patient care situations under a
12	license, certificate, or registration issued by this state or a
13	person providing direct patient care in the course of a training or
14	educational program.
15	(2) "Rural county" means a county in this state with a
16	population of less than 100,000.
17	Sec. 61.672. LOAN REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE AUTHORIZED. The
18	board shall provide, in accordance with this subchapter and board
19	rules, assistance in the repayment of eligible student loans for
20	eligible health care workers who apply and qualify for the
21	assistance.
22	Sec. 61.673. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive loan
23	repayment assistance under this subchapter, a health care worker
24	may not be receiving loan repayment assistance under another

- 1 program administered by the board and must:
- 2 (1) apply to the board in a manner prescribed by the
- 3 board;
- 4 (2) at the time of application for repayment
- 5 assistance be employed full-time as a health care worker in a rural
- 6 county; and
- 7 (3) commit to full-time employment as a health care
- 8 worker in a rural county for not less than two years after the
- 9 <u>health care worker receives the loan repayment lump sum under</u>
- 10 Section 61.676.
- Sec. 61.674. LIMITATIONS. A health care worker may receive
- 12 loan repayment assistance under this subchapter for not more than
- 13 four years.
- Sec. 61.675. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide loan
- 15 repayment assistance under this subchapter for the repayment of any
- 16 student loan for education at an institution of higher education, a
- 17 private or independent institution of higher education, or a public
- 18 or private out-of-state institution of higher education accredited
- 19 by a recognized accrediting agency, including loans for
- 20 undergraduate education, received by an eligible person through any
- 21 lender.
- 22 <u>(b) The board may not provide repayment assistance for a</u>
- 23 student loan that is in default at the time of the person's
- 24 application.
- 25 (c) In each state fiscal biennium, the board shall attempt
- 26 to allocate all funds appropriated to the board for the purpose of
- 27 providing loan repayment assistance under this subchapter.

- 1 Sec. 61.676. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall deliver any
- 2 repayment under this subchapter in a lump sum payable:
- 3 (1) to both the lender or other holder of the loan and
- 4 the health care worker; or
- 5 (2) directly to the lender or other holder of the loan
- 6 on the health care worker's behalf.
- 7 (b) A repayment under this subchapter may be applied to any
- 8 amount due in connection with the loan.
- 9 Sec. 61.677. AMOUNT OF REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE. (a) A health
- 10 care worker may receive loan repayment assistance under this
- 11 subchapter for each year the health care worker establishes
- 12 eligibility for the assistance in an amount determined by the
- 13 board.
- 14 (b) The board by rule shall determine the maximum amount of
- 15 loan repayment assistance received by a health care worker under
- 16 this subchapter in any one year.
- 17 (c) The total amount of loan repayment assistance provided
- 18 under this subchapter may not exceed the sum of:
- 19 (1) the total amount of gifts and grants accepted by
- 20 the board for the repayment assistance;
- 21 (2) legislative appropriations for the repayment
- 22 <u>assistance; and</u>
- 23 (3) other funds available to the board for the
- 24 repayment assistance.
- 25 (d) The board may adjust in an equitable manner the
- 26 <u>distribution amounts that health care workers would otherwise</u>
- 27 receive under Subsection (a) for a year as necessary to comply with

- 1 Subsection (c).
- 2 Sec. 61.678. RULES; ADMINISTRATION. (a) The board shall
- 3 adopt rules necessary to administer this subchapter.
- 4 (b) The board shall distribute to each institution of higher
- 5 education or private or independent institution of higher education
- 6 and to any appropriate state agency and professional association
- 7 copies of the rules adopted under this section and other pertinent
- 8 information relating to this subchapter.
- 9 (c) The board shall administer the program under this
- 10 subchapter in a manner that maximizes any matching funds available
- 11 through other sources.
- 12 (d) A reasonable amount, not to exceed three percent, of any
- 13 money appropriated for purposes of this subchapter may be used to
- 14 pay the costs of administering this subchapter.
- 15 Sec. 61.679. SOLICITATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS. The
- 16 board may solicit and accept gifts and grants from any public or
- 17 private source for the purposes of this subchapter.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
