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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of the Briar Branch Estates Municipal Utility District of Hunt County; granting a limited power of 3 eminent domain; providing authority to issue bonds; providing 4 5 authority to impose assessments, fees, and taxes. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws 7 Code, is amended by adding Chapter 8011A to read as follows: 8 CHAPTER 8011A. BRIAR BRANCH ESTATES MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT OF 9 HUNT COUNTY 10 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS 11 12 Sec. 8011A.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter: "Board" means the district's board of directors. 13 (1) (2) "Commission" means the <u>Texas</u> Commission on 14 15 Environmental Quality. 16 (3) "Director" means a board member. (4) "District" means the Briar Branch Estates 17 Municipal Utility District of Hunt County. 18 Sec. 8011A.0102. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a 19 municipal utility district created under Section 59, Article XVI, 20 21 Texas Constitution. Sec. 8011A.0103. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTOR ELECTION 22 23 REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent 24

1	directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.
2	Sec. 8011A.0104. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The
3	temporary directors may not hold an election under Section
4	8011A.0103 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or
5	extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has
6	consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the
7	district and to the inclusion of land in the district as required by
8	applicable law.
9	Sec. 8011A.0105. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT.
10	(a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit.
11	(b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:
12	(1) a municipal utility district as provided by
13	general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution; and
14	(2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that
15	relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation,
16	or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or
17	improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.
18	Sec. 8011A.0106. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The
19	district is initially composed of the territory described by
20	Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter.
21	(b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of
22	the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the
23	field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process
24	does not affect the district's:
25	(1) organization, existence, or validity;
26	(2) right to issue any type of bond for the purposes
27	for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and

1	interest on a bond;
2	(3) right to impose a tax; or
3	(4) legality or operation.
4	SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS
5	Sec. 8011A.0201. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district
6	is governed by a board of five elected directors.
7	(b) Except as provided by Section 8011A.0202, directors
8	serve staggered four-year terms.
9	Sec. 8011A.0202. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) The temporary
10	board consists of:
11	(1) Bobby Pannkuk;
12	(2) Rob Lyday;
13	(3) Peter Kim;
14	(4) Julio Ramos; and
15	(5) Harvey Chavez.
16	(b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:
17	(1) the date permanent directors are elected under
18	Section 8011A.0103; or
19	(2) the fourth anniversary of the effective date of
20	the Act enacting this chapter.
21	(c) If permanent directors have not been elected under
22	Section 8011A.0103 and the terms of the temporary directors have
23	expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or
24	reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that
25	expire on the earlier of:
26	(1) the date permanent directors are elected under
27	Section 8011A.0103; or

No. 2621 1 (2) the fourth anniversary of the date of the 2 appointment or reappointment. 3 (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district 4 may submit a petition to the commission requesting that the 5 commission appoint as successor temporary directors the five 6 persons named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as 7 successor temporary directors the five persons named in the 8 petition. 9 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES 10 Sec. 8011A.0301. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district 11 12 has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for which the district is created. 13 Sec. 8011A.0302. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND 14 15 DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, 16 17 applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution. 18 Sec. 8011A.0303. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under 19 Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may 20 design, acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve, 21 operate, maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a 22 municipality for operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled, 23 24 or paved roads, or improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads. 25 Sec. 8011A.0304. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A 26 road project must meet all applicable construction standards, 27

S.B. No. 2621 1 zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial 2 3 jurisdiction the road project is located. 4 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits 5 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road project must meet all applicable construction standards, 6 7 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which 8 the road project is located. 9 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans 10 and specifications of the road project. 11 12 Sec. 8011A.0305. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION. The district shall comply with all 13 applicable requirements of any ordinance or resolution that is 14 15 adopted under Section 54.016 or 54.0165, Water Code, and that consents to the creation of the district or to the inclusion of land 16 17 in the district. Sec. 8011A.0306. DIVISION OF DISTRICT. (a) The board, on 18 19 its own motion or on receipt of a petition signed by the owner or owners of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in 20 the district, may adopt an order dividing the district. 21 22 (b) An order dividing a district may create one or more new districts and may provide for the continuation of the district. 23 24 (c) An order dividing the district shall: 25 name any new district; (2) include the metes and bounds description of the 26

27 <u>territory of each of the districts;</u>

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1	(3) appoint temporary directors for any new district;
2	and
3	(4) provide for the division of assets and liabilities
4	between the districts.
5	(d) The board may adopt an order dividing the district
6	before or after the date the board holds an election to confirm the
7	district's creation.
8	(e) The district may be divided only if the district:
9	(1) has never issued any bonds; and
10	(2) is not imposing ad valorem taxes.
11	(f) A new district created by the division of the district
12	may not, at the time the new district is created, contain any land
13	outside the area described by Section 2 of the Act enacting this
14	<u>chapter.</u>
15	(g) On or before the 30th day after the date of adoption of
16	an order dividing the district, the district shall file the order
17	with the commission and record the order in the real property
18	records of each county in which the district is located.
19	(h) This chapter applies to any new district created by the
20	division of the district, and a new district has all the powers and
21	duties of the district.
22	(i) A new district created by the division of the district
23	shall hold a confirmation and directors' election.
24	(j) If the creation of the new district is confirmed, the
25	new district shall provide the election date and results to the
26	commission.
27	(k) A new district created by the division of the district

1 must hold an election as required by this chapter to obtain voter approval before the district may impose a maintenance tax or issue 2 bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes. 3 4 (1) The district may continue to rely on confirmation, 5 directors', bond, or tax elections held prior to the division. 6 (m) Municipal consent to the creation of the district and to 7 the inclusion of land in the district acts as municipal consent to 8 the creation of any new district created by the division of the district and to the inclusion of land in the new district. 9 SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS 10 Sec. 8011A.0401. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. (a) 11 12 The district may issue, without an election, bonds and other obligations secured by: 13 14 (1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or 15 (2) contract payments described by Section 8011A.0403. 16 17 (b) The district must hold an election in the manner provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to obtain voter approval 18 19 before the district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds payable from ad valorem taxes. 20 21 (c) The district may not issue bonds payable from ad valorem 22 taxes to finance a road project unless the issuance is approved by a vote of a two-thirds majority of the district voters voting at an 23 24 election held for that purpose. Sec. 8011A.0402. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If 25 26 authorized at an election held under Section 8011A.0401, the district may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable 27

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1 property in the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water
2 Code.

3 (b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not
4 exceed the rate approved at the election.

5 <u>Sec. 8011A.0403. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with</u> 6 <u>Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than</u> 7 <u>an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from</u> 8 <u>the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of</u> 9 <u>the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters</u> 10 <u>voting at an election held for that purpose.</u>

11 (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a 12 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by 13 the board without further voter approval.

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SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS

Sec. 8011A.0501. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS. The district may issue bonds or other obligations payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees, revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any combination of those sources, to pay for any authorized district purpose.

21 <u>Sec. 8011A.0502. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district</u> 22 <u>issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the</u> 23 <u>board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing</u> 24 <u>direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all</u> 25 <u>or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner</u> 26 <u>provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code.</u>

27 Sec. 8011A.0503. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of

1 <u>issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations</u> 2 <u>issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad</u> 3 <u>valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the</u> 4 <u>real property in the district.</u>

5 SECTION 2. The Briar Branch Estates Municipal Utility 6 District of Hunt County initially includes all the territory 7 contained in the following area:

8 All of that certain lot, tract, or parcel of land situated in the Benjamin Lindsey Survey, Abstract No. 635, the James Moore Survey, 9 10 Abstract No. 654, and the George W. Van Cleave Survey, Abstract No. 1074, Hunt County, Texas, being all of that certain tract of 11 land described in the deed from Jacky G. Leinart to Jerry L. 12 Leinart, as recorded in Document Number 2010-11417 of the Reap 13 14 Property Records of Hunt County, Texas (hereinafter called Subject 15 Tract One), being all of that certain tract of land described in the deed from Jacky G. THENCE S. 88 deg. 56 min. 31 sec. W. a distance of 386.19 feet along the South line of the said Subject Tract One and the North line of the said Doyle tract to the POINT OF BEGINNING and containing 145.19 acres of land.

26 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to 27 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this

Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
 Government Code.

6 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has 7 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on 8 Environmental Quality.

9 The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed (c) 10 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker 11 of the house of 12 representatives within the required time.

13 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this 14 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect 15 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled 16 and accomplished.

SECTION 4. (a) If this Act does not receive a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to each house, Subchapter C, Chapter 8011A, Special District Local Laws Code, as added by Section 1 of this Act, is amended by adding Section 8011A.0307 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 8011A.0307. NO EMINENT DOMAIN POWER. The district may</u> 23 <u>not exercise the power of eminent domain.</u>

(b) This section is not intended to be an expression of a
legislative interpretation of the requirements of Section 17(c),
Article I, Texas Constitution.

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SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
