- 1 WHEREAS, The Texas Black Reconstruction Legislators
- 2 Recognition Act seeks to erect historical markers in honor of
- 3 African American legislators who served the state during the 12th
- 4 through 14th Texas Legislatures; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the 88th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 6 hereby adopt, for the purpose of the Reconstruction Texas
- 7 Legislator Historical Marker Program, the following standardized
- 8 spellings, capitalizations, dates of birth, and counties of service
- 9 to create the historical markers detailed in the Texas Black
- 10 Reconstruction Legislators Recognition Act:

- 21 use these standardized spellings, capitalizations, dates of birth,
- 22 and counties of service for this historical marker program; and, be
- 23 it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward an
- 25 official copy of this resolution to the executive director of the
- 26 Texas Historical Commission.
