SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 1 proposing a constitutional amendment regarding the time during 2 which the legislature may act on bills or resolutions during a 3 regular session. 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Sections 5(b) and (c), Article III, Texas 7 Constitution, are amended to read as follows: 8 When convened in regular session [Session], the first 30 (b) [thirty] days thereof shall be devoted to the introduction of and 9 holding committee hearings to consider bills and resolutions [au10 acting upon emergency appropriations, passing upon the 11 confirmation of the recess appointees of the Governor and such 12 emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor in special 13 messages to the Legislature]. During the remainder of the session 14 15 [succeeding thirty days of the regular session of] the Legislature may continue to introduce bills and resolutions and the various 16 17 committees of each House shall hold hearings to consider all bills and resolutions and other matters then pending and [; and such 18 emergency matters as may be submitted by the Governor. During the 19 20 remainder of the session] the Legislature shall act upon such bills and resolutions as may be then pending. The Legislature may at any 21 time during a regular session consider the confirmation of the 22 recess appointees of the Governor and act on emergency 23 24 appropriations and [upon] such emergency matters as may be

submitted by the Governor in special messages to the Legislature.
(c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), either House may
determine its order of business by an affirmative vote of
<u>two-thirds [four-fifths]</u> of its membership.

5 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be 6 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 7, 2023. 7 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the 8 proposition: "The constitutional amendment regarding the time 9 during which the legislature may act on bills or resolutions during 10 a regular session."
