## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, In the early 1960s, leaders in the medical specialty 2 of anesthesiology recognized the existence of staffing shortages, 3 and to meet growing demands and accommodate the increasing 4 complexity of anesthesia and surgery, a group of anesthesiologists 5 proposed the precursor to what is now the health care occupation of 6 certified anesthesiologist assistant; and

7 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants are highly 8 skilled health professionals who work under the direction of 9 licensed physician anesthesiologists to implement anesthesia care 10 plans and work exclusively within the Anesthesia Care Team model, 11 as described by the American Society of Anesthesiologists; and

12 WHEREAS, All CAA students must have earned a baccalaureate 13 degree with premedical coursework to be admitted into a CAA 14 training program and must complete a comprehensive didactic and 15 clinical program at the graduate level; and

16 WHEREAS, CAA training programs must also include a minimum of 24 months in a master's level program accredited by the Commission 17 on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs and must be 18 based at, or work in collaboration with, a university that has a 19 20 medical school and academic anesthesiologist physician faculty; as part of their CAA training, students are typically required to 21 successfully complete an average of 600 hours of classroom and 22 23 laboratory education and 2,600 hours of clinical anesthesia education; they are also required to administer a total of more than 24

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1 600 anesthetics and to gain experience in all types of surgery; and WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants are trained 2 3 extensively in the delivery and maintenance of quality anesthesia care as well as advanced patient monitoring techniques; they 4 perform tasks such as administering drugs, obtaining vascular 5 access, applying and interpreting monitors, establishing and 6 maintaining patient airways, and assisting with preoperative 7 8 assessment; and

9 WHEREAS, In 2010, Dr. Carin Hagberg, in her role as the chief 10 of anesthesiology for The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, developed a partnership with Case Western Reserve 11 12 University to start a CAA program in Houston; it received initial accreditation in 2010 from the Commission on Accreditation of 13 14 Allied Health Education Programs and the Accreditation Review 15 Committee for the Anesthesiologist Assistant; that same year, 16 graduate students were enrolled in the program, and they completed 16 17 their studies in 2012; and

18 WHEREAS, In 2019, under the guidance of program director 19 Kenneth Maloney, CAA, the Case Western Reserve University 20 Anesthesiologist Assistant Program expanded to provide clinical 21 rotations in Central Texas at Baylor Scott and White Health in North 22 Austin; and

23 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants currently 24 provide anesthesia within an anesthesia care team at many major 25 hospitals in Texas, including the Heart Hospital of Austin, Baylor 26 Scott and White Health, Children's Medical Center Dallas, Methodist 27 Hospital, Memorial Hermann Orthopedic and Spine Hospital, Memorial

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Hermann Southwest, Memorial Hermann The Woodlands, Memorial
Hermann Sugar Land, St. David's Hospital System in Austin, and
Texas Heart Institute at Baylor St. Luke's Medical Center; and

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WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants practice in 4 5 19 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Territory of Guam; they also practice within the Medicare system and provide 6 anesthesia services for a multitude of medical procedures every 7 8 year in the United States; they have practiced in Texas since 1997, when Dr. John Zerwas of Greater Houston Anesthesiology brought them 9 10 into the practice to address the shortage in anesthesia providers; 11 and

WHEREAS, The Texas Academy of Anesthesiologist Assistants is dedicated to the ethical advancement of the CAA profession and to creating a better future through innovation, cutting-edge medicine, advocacy, and education; the academy is ably led by president Tasha Krueger, CAA, Tim Goodridge, CAA, and secretary Thao Nguyen, CAA, as well as board members Frank Trzaska, CAA, Jana McAllister, CAA, and Paul McHorse, CAA; and

19 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants have dedicated their careers to serving the citizens of Texas, and they 20 are indeed deserving of special commendation; now, therefore, be it 21 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the 88th Texas Legislature 22 hereby recognize the week of February 20 through February 24, 2023, 23 24 as Certified Anesthesiologist Assistant Week in Texas and encourage 25 residents of the Lone Star State to pay tribute to these invaluable 26 professionals.

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
