WHEREAS, Laredo was established in 1755 by Don Tomás Sánchez, and its history offers a compelling tale, as the town was forged by Spaniards, Indians, Mexicans, Texans, and Americans; a dynamic bilingual and bicultural community, this Texas city is proud of its Mexican roots; seven flags have flown over Laredo, and this unique city celebrates its dual historical and cultural ties throughout the year; and

11 WHEREAS, Situated on the banks of the Rio Grande, Laredo is 12 now the 10th-largest city in Texas and the number one inland port on 13 the southern United States border; in addition, it is one of the top 14 three ports of commerce in the nation, and in 2021, the city handled 15 almost 60 percent of all overland trade between Texas and Mexico; 16 and

WHEREAS, Laredo represents a strong economic driver for the 17 United States, handling more than \$240 billion in total trade by 18 value with the world and over five million commercial trucks 19 20 annually; through trade activity, the city has contributed more 21 than 474,000 direct and indirect jobs for the state of Texas, and in 2022, it generated 2,563 jobs; Laredo is also home to multiple 22 23 institutes of higher learning, including Laredo College and Texas A&M International University; and 24
