**IN RE: HB1629** by Wu (Relating to changing the eligibility for community supervision of a person convicted of certain burglary offenses.), **As Introduced** 

#### No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would remove certain burglary offenses punishable as a first degree felony from the list of offenses for which a conviction makes a defendant ineligible for judge-ordered community supervision. It is assumed that any fiscal impact and impact on state correctional populations or on the demand for state correctional resources would not be significant.

## Local Government Impact

It is assumed that any fiscal impact to units of local government associated with enforcement, prosecution, supervision, or confinement would not be significant.
