**IN RE: HB1807** by Jones, Jolanda (relating to the offense of failure to comply with an order from a fire marshal and the authority of certain county peace officers to issue citations for certain violations; changing a criminal penalty.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

**No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.**

The bill would modify the misdemeanor punishment for failing to comply with an order of a county fire marshal by making a first offense punishable as a Class C misdemeanor, a second offense punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, and an offense resulting in bodily injury or death punishable as a Class A misdemeanor. The bill would authorize certain county employees to issue a citation for a violation related to certain orders from a fire marshal or commissioners court and authorize the court to issue an arrest warrant for such a violation under certain conditions.

It is assumed that any fiscal impact and any impact on state correctional populations or on the demand for state correctional resources would not be significant.

**Local Government Impact**

It is assumed that any fiscal impact to units of local government associated with enforcement, prosecution, supervision, or confinement would not be significant.
