IN RE: HB2270 by Moody (relating to a requirement that certain students, interns, residents, and fellows receiving a clinical education at public or nonprofit hospitals receive time off to undergo an annual comprehensive health examination.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

While some health-related institutions of higher education reported potential costs and lost revenue, it is assumed that any of these costs associated with the bill could be absorbed using existing resources.
