IN RE: HB3848 by Oliverson (Relating to health maintenance organization and preferred provider benefit plan minimum access standards for nonemergency ambulance transport services delivered by emergency medical services providers; providing administrative penalties.), **As Introduced**

<p>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</p>
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Based on the analysis of the Comptroller of Public Accounts, State Office of Administrative Hearings, Department of Insurance, Health and Human Services Commission, Texas A&M University System Administrative & General Offices, and the University of Texas System Administration, any duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by the agencies utilizing existing resources.
