IN RE: HB4952 by Slawson (relating to the security of the electricity supply chain.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

Based on the analysis of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, Department of Public Safety, Railroad Commission, Texas Division of Emergency Management and Texas A&M University System Administration, duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
