IN RE: SB2045 by Hancock (Relating to data or information collected by the statewide all payor claims database and the composition of the stakeholder advisory group.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

It is assumed that any costs associated with the bill could be absorbed using existing resources during the 2024-25 biennium.

However, based on responses by The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston, there could be significant costs for the institution beginning in fiscal year 2026 based on the need for additional staff, technology, and contracting costs associated with implementation of the bill.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
