Relating to the required reporting of multiple sales of certain firearms to law enforcement.

Relating to the offense of unlawful transfer of handguns and other firearms and to the duties of certain entities with respect to handgun licenses that are active, suspended, or revoked; creating a criminal offense.

HB 1138 Martinez Posting Rule Suspended Relating to the prosecution of the criminal offense of reckless discharge of a firearm.

HB 236 Goodwin

Relating to requiring a national instant criminal background check in connection with private firearm transfers; creating a criminal offense.

HB 298 Goodwin

Relating to a required waiting period for firearm sales; creating a criminal offense.

Relating to the seizure of firearms during the emergency detention of certain persons who may have a mental illness.
