Relating to the requirements for the renewal of a driver's license, personal identification certificate, commercial driver's license, or commercial learner's permit for a sex offender.

Relating to requiring social media platform operators to identify and notify law enforcement of credible threats of violence published on their platforms; creating a criminal offense.

Relating to a law enforcement agency policy regarding drug and alcohol testing of peace officers involved in certain injuries or deaths.

Relating to the issuance of specially marked driver's licenses and personal identification certificates to veterans.

Relating to a central database containing information about offenders who have committed certain violent offenses against intimate partners.

Relating to an optional health condition or disability designation on a driver's license or personal identification certificate.

Relating to compensation and leave for certain security officers or investigators commissioned as peace officers by the comptroller.
