Relating to the duration of services provided under Medicaid to women following a pregnancy.

HB 400 Klick | et al. SP: Kolkhorst
Relating to innovation grant programs to support residency training programs in psychiatric specialty fields and recruitment, training, and retention programs in behavioral health fields.

HB 625 Harris, Cody | et al. SP: Schwertner
Relating to copayments required by a health maintenance organization or preferred provider benefit plan for visiting physical therapists.

HB 729 Rose | et al. SP: West
Relating to the statewide intellectual and developmental disability coordinating council.

HB 968 Gates | et al. SP: Kolkhorst
Relating to procedures in certain suits affecting the parent-child relationship filed by the Department of Family and Protective Services.

Relating to the effect of certain reductions in a health benefit plan enrollee's out-of-pocket expenses for certain prescription drugs on enrollee cost-sharing requirements.

HB 1009 Turner SP: West
Relating to criminal history record information reviews of certain individuals providing services to individuals with an intellectual or developmental disability under Medicaid; providing an administrative penalty.

HB 1167 Romero, Jr. | et al. SP: Zaffirini
Relating to the licensing of marriage and family therapists, marriage and family therapist associates, professional counselors, professional counselor associates, and social workers, including certain out-of-state applicants.

HB 1649 Button | et al. SP: Parker
Relating to health benefit coverage for certain fertility preservation services under certain health benefit plans.

HB 2002 Oliverson | et al. SP: Hancock
Relating to preferred provider benefit plan out-of-pocket expense credits for payments made by an insured directly to a physician or health care provider.

HB 2556 Oliverson | et al. SP: Schwertner
Relating to the licensing and regulation of physician graduates and the authority of an insured to select a physician graduate under the insured's health insurance policy; requiring an occupational license; authorizing fees.

HB 2651 Howard | et al. SP: Blanco
Relating to required training and continuing education requirements for persons who provide medical care or other support to survivors of sexual assault.

HB 2969 Cook | et al. SP: Hancock
Relating to prohibiting a maximum age or age differential for prospective adoptive parents.

HB 3162 Klick | et al. SP: Hughes
Relating to advance directives, do-not-resuscitate orders, and health care treatment decisions made by or on behalf of certain patients, including a review of directives and decisions.

HB 3265 Manuel SP: Alvarado
Relating to the submission of certain reports by the Health and Human Services Commission.

HB 3286 Klick | et al. SP: Hancock
Relating to prescription drug benefits under Medicaid and the child health plan program.

HB 3462 Noble SP: Sparks
Relating to the consolidation of ombudsman programs administered by the Health and Human Services Commission.

HB 4091 Johnson, Ann | et al. SP: Kolkhorst
Relating to a request for admission to a specialty inpatient stabilization treatment program by the Department of Family and Protective Services of certain minors in the managing conservatorship of the department.

HB 4170 Campos SP: LaMantia
Relating to enforcement actions taken against a child-care or child-placing agency administrator's license.

HB 4500 Harris, Caroline SP: Hughes
Relating to electronic verification of health benefits by health benefit plan issuers for certain physicians and health care providers.

HB 4696 Noble SP: Miles
Relating to the reporting and investigation of certain allegations of abuse, neglect, and exploitation, the making and investigation of complaints alleging violations of certain health facility licensing requirements, and the content of the employee misconduct registry.

HB 4888 Hefner SP: Perry
Relating to Medicaid coverage and reimbursement for non-opioid treatments.

SB 2632 Hall | et al.
Relating to required labeling of meat food products that contain mRNA vaccine material.
