(E) one physician specializing in family

(F) one physician specializing in psychiatry;
(G) one physician specializing in pathology;
(H) one epidemiologist, biostatistician, or
researcher of pregnancy-related deaths;
(I) one social worker or social service provider;
(J) <u>two</u> [one] community <u>advocates</u> [advocate] in a

Section 34.003(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 18 Review committee members appointed by the commissioner 19 (a) serve staggered six-year terms, with one-third or as near as 20 possible to one-third of the members' terms [of four or five 21 members, as appropriate,] expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered 22 23 year. 24 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
