H.B. No. 852

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the composition of the Texas Maternal Mortality and Morbidity Review Committee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 34.002(b), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(b) The review committee is a multidisciplinary advisory committee within the department and is composed of the following 23 ~~[17]~~ members:

(1) 21 ~~[15]~~ members appointed by the commissioner as follows:

(A) four physicians specializing in obstetrics, at least one of whom is a maternal fetal medicine specialist;

(B) one certified nurse-midwife;

(C) one registered nurse;

(D) one nurse specializing in labor and delivery;

(E) one physician specializing in family practice;

(F) one physician specializing in psychiatry;

(G) one physician specializing in pathology;

(H) one epidemiologist, biostatistician, or researcher of pregnancy-related deaths;

(I) one social worker or social service provider;

(J) two ~~[one]~~ community advocates ~~[advocate]~~ in a

2 (K) one medical examiner or coroner responsible

4 (L) one physician specializing in critical care;

22 ~~members, as appropriate,~~] expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered
23 year.
