SECTION 2. Section 85.005(c), Election Code, is amended to

- Voting [In a county with a population of 55,000 or more, 2 3 the voting] in a primary election or the general election for state and county officers shall be conducted at the main early voting 4 polling place for at least 12 hours on each weekday of the last week 5 of the early voting period, and the voting in a special election 6 ordered by the governor shall be conducted at the main early voting 7 8 polling place for at least 12 hours on each of the last two days of the early voting period. Voting under this subsection may not be 9 10 conducted earlier than 6 a.m. or later than 10 p.m. [Voting shall be conducted in accordance with this subsection in those elections 11 in a county with a population under 55,000 on receipt by the early 12 voting clerk of a written request for the extended hours submitted 13 by at least 15 registered voters of the county. The request must be 14 15 submitted in time to enable compliance with Section 85.067. SECTION 3. Section 85.006(e), Election Code, is amended to 16 17 read as follows:
- In a primary election or the general election for state 18 19 and county officers [in a county with a population of 55,000 or more], the early voting clerk shall order voting by personal 20 appearance at the main early voting polling place to be conducted on 21 the last Saturday of the early voting period for at least 12 hours, 22 23 except that voting may not be conducted earlier than 6 a.m. or later 24 than 10 p.m., and on the last Sunday of the early voting period for at least six hours, except that voting may not be conducted earlier 25 26 than 9 a.m. or later than 10 p.m. [The early voting clerk shall order voting to be conducted at those times in those elections 27
