8	Sec. 99.008. OPEN BURN PIT REGISTRY FUND. (a) The open
9	burn pit registry fund is a special fund in the state treasury
10	outside the general revenue fund. The fund is composed of:
11	(1) money transferred to the fund at the direction of
12	the legislature;
13	(2) gifts and grants contributed to the fund;
14	(3) the earnings of the fund; and
15	(4) money deposited to the credit of the fund under
16	Section 504.679, Transportation Code.
17	(b) Money in the fund may be appropriated only to the
18	department. The department may use the money only for the creation
19	and maintenance of the open burn pit registry established under
20	Section 99.003, except that the department may use the money for any
21	other purpose of the department consistent with legislative
22	appropriation of the money if the department finds that the
23	registry is adequately funded and contributions to the fund exceed
24	the amount necessary for the registry to be adequately funded.

- 5 the United States armed forces who were exposed to open burn pits
- 6 during their military service. The license plates must include:
- 7 (1) the words "Burn Pits 360 Veterans Organization";
- 8 <u>and</u>
- 9 (2) a depiction of the Burn Pits 360 nonprofit
- 10 organization logo.
- 11 (b) After deduction of the department's administrative
- 12 costs, the remainder of the fee for issuance of the license plates
- 13 shall be deposited to the credit of the open burn pit registry fund
- 14 established under Section 99.008, Health and Safety Code.
- (c) Section 504.702 does not apply to a specialty license
- 16 plate issued under this section.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

The bill would create the Open Burn Pit Registry Fund in the state treasury outside the General Revenue Fund. The bill would authorize money in the fund to be appropriated only to the Department of State Health Services (DSHS) for the purpose of creating and maintaining the open burn pit registry.

Based on the information provided by TxDMV and DSHS, it is assumed any costs or duties associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be absorbed within the agencies' existing resources.

Additionally, according to information provided by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts, the fiscal impact to the State resulting from the implementation of the bill cannot be determined.

Note: This legislation would do one or more of the following: create or recreate a dedicated account in the General Revenue Fund, create or recreate a special or trust fund either in, with, or outside the Treasury, or create a dedicated revenue source. The fund, account, or revenue dedication included in this bill would be subject to funds consolidation review by the current Legislature.
