A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 254, Election Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 254.044 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 254.044. REPORTING OF POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS AND
8	EXPENDITURES MADE USING CREDIT CARD. (a) A candidate or
9	officeholder who accepts a political contribution made using a
10	<pre>credit card shall:</pre>
11	(1) for a political contribution for which a
12	processing fee is deducted by the credit card issuer from the
13	political contribution amount:
14	(A) report as a political contribution the full
15	amount, including the deducted amount; and
16	(B) report as a political expenditure the
17	deducted amount; and
18	(2) for a political contribution for which a
19	processing fee is paid by the person making the political
20	contribution in excess of the political contribution amount:
21	(A) report as a political contribution the full
22	amount, not including the amount paid in excess of the political
23	contribution amount; and
24	(B) report as an in-kind contribution the amount

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- 1 paid in excess of the political contribution amount.
- 2 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter and
- 3 for purposes of reporting in-kind contributions under Subsection
- 4 (a)(2)(B), a candidate or officeholder may aggregate those in-kind
- 5 contributions for the reporting period during which the in-kind
- 6 contributions are accepted.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 254.044, Election Code, as added by this
- 8 Act, applies only to a report of political contributions and
- 9 expenditures under Chapter 254, Election Code, that is required to
- 10 be filed on or after January 1, 2024.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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Amend H.B. No. 3372 (senate committee report) in SECTION 1 of 1 2 the bill by striking added Sections 254.044(a)(2) and (b), Election Code (page 1, lines 37 through 49), and substituting the following: 3 (2) for a political contribution for which a 4 processing fee is paid by the person making the political 5 contribution in excess of the political contribution amount, report 6 as a political contribution the full amount, including the amount 7 paid in excess of the political contribution amount. 8 (b) The commission may not require a candidate or 9 officeholder who accepts a political contribution described by 10 Subsection (a)(2) to report as a political expenditure the excess 11 12 amount paid as a processing fee by the person making the political contribution.
