5 SECTION 1. Sections 539.002(a) and (b), Government Code,

6 are amended to read as follows:

7 (a) To the extent funds are appropriated to the department

 (a) To the extent funds are appropriated to the department for that purpose, the department shall make grants to entities, including local governmental entities, nonprofit community organizations, and faith-based community organizations, to establish or expand community collaboratives that bring the public and private sectors together to provide services to persons experiencing homelessness, substance abuse issues, or mental illness. In awarding grants, the department shall give special consideration to entities:
- 16 (1) establishing new collaboratives; [or]
- 17 (2) establishing or expanding collaboratives that 18 serve two or more counties, each with a population of less than 19 100,000; or
- 20 (3) providing services to an average of at least 50
 21 percent of persons experiencing homelessness in a geographic area
 22 served by a Continuum of Care Program funded by the United States
- 23 Department of Housing and Urban Development according to the last
- 24 three Point-in-Time surveys of homelessness conducted by that

- 1 <u>department</u>.
- 2 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), the department
- 3 shall require each entity awarded a grant under this section to:
- 4 (1) leverage additional funding or in-kind
- 5 contributions from private contributors or local governments,
- 6 excluding state or federal funds, in an amount that is at least
- 7 equal to the amount of the grant awarded under this section;
- 8 (2) provide evidence of significant coordination and
- 9 collaboration between the entity, local mental health authorities,
- 10 municipalities, local law enforcement agencies, and other
- 11 community stakeholders in establishing or expanding a community
- 12 collaborative funded by a grant awarded under this section; and
- 13 (3) provide evidence of a local law enforcement policy
- 14 to divert appropriate persons from jails, [or] other detention
- 15 facilities, or mental health facilities operated by or under
