17	as described by Section 43.05, Penal Code;
18	(2) [τ or] trafficking of persons as described by
19	Section 20A.02, Penal Code; or
20	(3) operating, maintaining, or advertising a massage
21	establishment, as defined by Section 455.001, Occupations Code,
22	that is not in compliance with:
23	(A) Chapter 455, Occupations Code; or
24	(B) an applicable local ordinance relating to the

- 1 licensing or regulation of a massage establishment.
- 2 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 3 a commercial lease that is entered into or renewed on or after the
- 4 effective date of this Act. A commercial lease that is entered into
- 5 or renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the
- 6 law applicable to the lease immediately before the effective date
- 7 of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
