19	(A) is a commercial driver's license holder or
20	was a commercial driver's license holder at the time of the offense;
21	(B) was operating a commercial motor vehicle at
22	the time of the offense; or
23	(C) was operating a motor vehicle and
24	transporting a hazardous material at the time of the offense; or
