A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to making supplemental appropriations for disaster relief
- 3 and giving direction and adjustment authority regarding those
- 4 appropriations.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. TRUSTEED PROGRAMS WITHIN THE OFFICE OF THE
- 7 GOVERNOR: FEMA MATCH AND DISASTER FUNDS. The amount of
- 8 \$200,000,000 is appropriated from the economic stabilization fund
- 9 to the Trusteed Programs within the Office of the Governor for the
- 10 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act to be
- 11 used:
- 12 (1) to match federal money received related to
- 13 disaster response, relief, and recovery; and
- 14 (2) for the disaster needs of this state in a manner
- 15 consistent with Strategy A.1.1, Disaster Funds, as listed in
- 16 Chapter 1170 (H.B. 1), Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular
- 17 Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), and Chapter 1185
- 18 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025 (the
- 19 General Appropriations Act).
- 20 SECTION 2. TRUSTEED PROGRAMS WITHIN THE OFFICE OF THE
- 21 GOVERNOR: LOCAL GRANTS. The amount of \$50,000,000 is appropriated
- 22 from the economic stabilization fund to the Trusteed Programs
- 23 within the Office of the Governor for the two-year period beginning
- 24 on the effective date of this Act to be used for the purpose of

- 1 making grants to assist counties, municipalities, or other local
- 2 governments operating within Bandera, Bexar, Burnet, Caldwell,
- 3 Coke, Comal, Concho, Edwards, Gillespie, Hamilton, Kendall, Kerr,
- 4 Kimble, Kinney, Lampasas, Llano, Mason, Maverick, McCulloch,
- 5 Menard, Real, Reeves, San Saba, Schleicher, Sutton, Tom Green,
- 6 Travis, Uvalde, or Williamson County, as provided by the governor's
- 7 declaration of disaster on July 4, 2025, regarding a heavy rainfall
- 8 and flooding event and the subsequent amendments to that
- 9 declaration, in establishing and implementing a system of flood
- 10 warning sirens and rain gauges and purchasing other related
- 11 equipment.
- 12 SECTION 3. TRUSTEED PROGRAMS WITHIN THE OFFICE OF THE
- 13 GOVERNOR: METEOROLOGICAL FORECASTING. The amount of \$24,000,000 is
- 14 appropriated from the economic stabilization fund to the Trusteed
- 15 Programs within the Office of the Governor for the two-year period
- 16 beginning on the effective date of this Act to be used for the
- 17 purpose of providing disaster preparedness grants to improve
- 18 meteorological forecasting, enhance weather intelligence and
- 19 forecasting accuracy, and improve flood management and timeliness
- 20 of flood warnings in the Texas Hill Country through high resolution
- 21 integrated weather solutions.
- 22 SECTION 4. CONTINGENT APPROPRIATIONS: INTEROPERABLE
- 23 EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS. (a) Contingent on the enactment of H.B.
- 24 2 or similar legislation of the 89th Legislature, 1st Called
- 25 Session, 2025, relating to the creation and operation of the Texas
- 26 Interoperability Council and a grant program administered by the
- 27 council, the amount of \$50,000,000 is appropriated from the

- 1 economic stabilization fund to the Texas Interoperability Council
- 2 for use by the council during the two-year period beginning on the
- 3 effective date of this Act to implement the provisions of that
- 4 legislation.
- 5 (b) Contingent on the failure to enact H.B. 2 or similar
- 6 legislation of the 89th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 2025,
- 7 relating to the creation and operation of the Texas
- 8 Interoperability Council and a grant program administered by the
- 9 council:
- 10 (1) the amount of \$50,000,000 is appropriated from the
- 11 economic stabilization fund to the comptroller of public accounts
- 12 for immediate deposit to the emergency radio infrastructure account
- 13 number 5153; and
- 14 (2) the amount of \$50,000,000 is appropriated from the
- 15 emergency radio infrastructure account number 5153 to the Trusteed
- 16 Programs Within the Office of the Governor to be used during the
- 17 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the
- 18 governor's interoperable radio communications program in
- 19 accordance with Subchapter F, Chapter 421, Government Code.
- 20 SECTION 5. LIMITATION, REPORTING, AND TRANSFER PROVISIONS
- 21 OF GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS ACTS APPLY. Unless explicitly stated
- 22 otherwise, the provisions relating to limitations, reporting, or
- 23 transfer of Chapter 1170 (H.B. 1), Acts of the 88th Legislature,
- 24 Regular Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), and Chapter
- 25 1185 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 89th Legislature, Regular Session, 2025
- 26 (the General Appropriations Act), apply to the appropriations made
- 27 by this Act.

- 1 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) Subject to Subsection (b) of
- 2 this section, this Act takes effect immediately.
- 3 (b) This Act takes effect only if it receives a vote of
- 4 two-thirds of the members present in each house of the legislature,
- 5 as provided by Section 49-g(m), Article III, Texas Constitution.
