## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the authority of the comptroller to provide funding for
3	the deployment and operation of certain emergency communication
4	systems.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 403.653(c), Government Code, as
7	effective September 1, 2025, is amended to read as follows:
8	(c) The fund may be used only for:
9	(1) a purpose described by Chapter 4901;
10	(2) providing funding for 9-1-1 and next generation
11	9-1-1 services under Chapter 771, Health and Safety Code;
12	(3) supporting the deployment of next generation 9-1-1
13	service, including its costs of equipment, operations, and
14	administration, as provided by Section 771.0713, Health and Safety
15	Code;
16	(4) supporting the Texas Broadband Pole Replacement
17	Program established under Section $403.553$ [ $403.503$ , as added by
18	Chapter 659 (H.B. 1505), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular
19	Session, 2021];
20	(5) providing matching funds for federal money
21	provided for the Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment Program;
22	(6) expanding access to broadband service in
23	economically distressed communities to support increased
24	connectivity needs in those areas; [and]

- 1 (7) supporting the deployment and operation,
- 2 including by funding costs for equipment, operation, and
- 3 administration, of:
- 4 (A) early warning and emergency systems to
- 5 provide notifications of natural disasters and other emergencies;
- 6 and
- 7 (B) interoperable emergency radio systems; and
- 8 (8) administering and enforcing this subchapter.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 490I.0106(d), Government Code, as
- 10 amended by S.B. No. 1405, Acts of the 89th Legislature, Regular
- 11 Session, 2025, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 (d) In making an award under this section, the [The] office
- 13 may not:
- 14 (1) except as provided by Section 490I.01062, favor a
- 15 particular broadband technology in awarding contracts, grants,
- 16 loans, or other financial incentives;
- 17 (2) award a contract, grant, loan, or other financial
- 18 incentive for the deployment of last-mile broadband service to a
- 19 noncommercial provider of broadband service for a broadband
- 20 serviceable location if an eligible commercial provider of
- 21 broadband service has submitted an application for the same
- 22 location;
- 23 (3) take into consideration distributions from the
- 24 state universal service fund established under Section 56.021,
- 25 Utilities Code, when deciding to award contracts, grants, loans, or
- 26 other financial incentives; or
- 27 (4) except as provided by Section 490I.01061, award a

- 1 contract, grant, loan, or other financial incentive for deployment
- 2 of last-mile broadband service for a location that is subject to an
- 3 existing federal commitment to deploy qualifying broadband service
- 4 on the date the application is submitted or during the application
- 5 process.
- 6 SECTION 3. Chapter 490I, Government Code, is amended by
- 7 adding Section 490I.01063 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 4901.01063. EMERGENCY COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS PROGRAM.
- 9 (a) The broadband development office may award contracts, grants,
- 10 low-interest loans, and other financial incentives to support the
- 11 <u>deployment and operation of:</u>
- (1) early warning and emergency systems to provide
- 13 notifications of natural disasters and other emergencies; and
- 14 (2) interoperable emergency radio systems.
- 15 (b) In implementing this section, the office may coordinate
- 16 with the office of the governor to support the governor's
- 17 interoperable radio communications program established under
- 18 Subchapter F, Chapter 421.
- (c) An award granted under this section does not affect the
- 20 <u>eligibility of a telecommunications provider to receive</u> support
- 21 from the state universal service fund under Section 56.021,
- 22 Utilities Code.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 24 last day of the legislative session.
