A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to certain measures to prevent and reduce fraudulent
3	charitable solicitations during disasters, including establishing
4	a voluntary certification program for disaster relief
5	organizations.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 418.0431 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 418.0431. EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS ON IDENTIFYING AND
10	AVOIDING FRAUDULENT CHARITABLE SOLICITATIONS. The division, in
11	consultation with the consumer protection division of the attorney
12	general's office, shall create and make available to the public on
13	the respective agencies' Internet websites educational materials
14	regarding how to identify and avoid fraudulent charitable
15	solicitations during a disaster.
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by
17	adding Subchapter L to read as follows:
18	SUBCHAPTER L. VOLUNTARY CERTIFICATION OF DISASTER RELIEF
19	ORGANIZATIONS
20	Sec. 418.401. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
21	(1) "Certification" means the certification issued to
22	a disaster relief organization under this subchapter.
23	(2) "Certification program" means the certification
24	program established under this subchapter.

1	(3) "Declared disaster" means:
2	(A) a disaster declared by the president of the
3	<pre>United States;</pre>
4	(B) a state of disaster declared by the governor
5	under Section 418.014; or
6	(C) a local state of disaster declared by the
7	presiding officer of the governing body of a political subdivision
8	under Section 418.108.
9	Sec. 418.402. VOLUNTARY CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR DISASTER
10	RELIEF ORGANIZATIONS. (a) The attorney general, in consultation
11	with the division, shall establish and administer a certification
12	program for organizations that solicit and accept donations to
13	provide disaster relief services during a declared disaster. The
14	purpose of the certification program is to assist the public in
15	identifying reputable organizations to which the public may donate
16	to support disaster relief efforts.
17	(b) Participation in the certification program is
18	voluntary. An organization is not required to obtain certification
19	under the program to solicit or accept donations in response to a
20	declared disaster.
21	Sec. 418.403. ELIGIBILITY FOR CERTIFICATION. (a) The
22	attorney general, in consultation with the division, shall by rule
23	<pre>establish:</pre>
24	(1) eligibility criteria that an organization must
25	meet and maintain to qualify for a certification;
26	(2) procedures for evaluating certification
27	applications; and

- 1 (3) procedures for renewal and revocation of
- 2 certifications.
- 3 (b) The attorney general may also consult with the emergency
- 4 management council for purposes of adopting rules under this
- 5 section.
- 6 Sec. 418.404. APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION. An
- 7 organization may apply for a certification in the form and manner
- 8 prescribed by the attorney general.
- 9 Sec. 418.405. PUBLIC REGISTRY; SEAL. (a) The attorney
- 10 general shall maintain and regularly update a public registry of
- 11 organizations certified under this subchapter on the attorney
- 12 general's Internet website.
- 13 (b) The attorney general shall prescribe and approve a seal
- 14 that may be used and displayed by an organization certified under
- 15 this subchapter.
- Sec. 418.406. CONSIDERATION OF CERTIFICATION STATUS IN
- 17 CERTAIN APPLICATIONS FOR STATE MONEY. Notwithstanding any other
- 18 law, a state or local governmental entity administering a grant or
- 19 other program that provides state money to support mitigation,
- 20 preparedness, response, recovery, or other relief efforts in
- 21 response to a declared disaster shall consider an organization's
- 22 <u>certification status under this subchapter when evaluating the</u>
- 23 organization's application for state money under the grant or other
- 24 program.
- 25 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 26 of this Act, the attorney general, in consultation with the Texas
- 27 Division of Emergency Management, shall adopt rules to implement

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- 1 Subchapter L, Chapter 418, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 2 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 3 last day of the legislative session.
