A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the provision of an abortion-inducing drug. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 171.063, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subsection (b) to read as follows: 5 6 (b) A physician may not provide to a pregnant woman an abortion-inducing drug unless the physician is physically present 7 in this state and examines the woman in person at the time the 8 9 physician provides the drug to the woman. SECTION 2. Section 151.056, Occupations Code, is amended by 10 11 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to read as 12 follows: 13 Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), this [This] (b) 14 section does not apply to the act of: 15 (1) a medical specialist located in another jurisdiction who provides only episodic consultation services on 16 request to a physician licensed in this state who practices in the 17 same medical specialty; 18 a physician located in another jurisdiction who is 19 (2) providing consultation services to a medical school as defined by 20 21 Section 61.501, Education Code; 22 (3) a physician located in another jurisdiction who is 23 providing consultation services to an institution subject to: (A) 24 Subchapter C, Chapter 73, Education Code; or

1 Subchapter K, Chapter 74, Education Code; or (B) 2 (4) a physician located in another jurisdiction of a state having borders contiguous with the borders of this state who 3 4 is the treating physician of a patient and orders home health or hospice services for a resident of this state to be delivered by a 5 6 home and community support services agency licensed in this state. 7 (b-1) This section applies to a consultation service described by Subsection (b)(1), (2), or (3) if the service is the 8 provision of an abortion-inducing drug, as defined by Section 9 171.061, Health and Safety Code. 10

11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the 12 last day of the legislative session.
