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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to requirements applicable to certain governmental entities that engage in lobbying. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 556, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 556.0056 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 556.0056. RESTRICTIONS ON LOBBYING EXPENDITURES AND 7 REIMBURSEMENTS BY CERTAIN GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES. (a) This section 8 9 applies only to a governmental entity authorized to impose a tax. (b) A governmental entity's governing body may not spend 10 public money obtained through taxes the entity imposes to contract 11 12 with a person required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305 to communicate directly with one or more members of the legislative 13 14 branch to influence legislation pending before the legislature unless the expenditure is: 15 (1) authorized by a majority vote of the governing 16 body in an open meeting of the governing body; and 17 18 (2) voted on by the governing body at the meeting as a stand-alone item on the agenda. 19 (c) A governmental entity that contracts with a person 20 required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305 in accordance 21 with this section must publish on the entity's Internet website: 22 23 (1) the amount of money authorized to be spent under 24 Subsection (b) to contract with the person;

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1	(2) the name of the person;
2	(3) a copy of the contract;
3	(4) the amount of money, if any, spent by the entity
4	for membership fees or dues to a nonprofit state association or
5	organization of similarly situated entities that contracts with a
6	person required to register as a lobbyist under Chapter 305; and
7	(5) a copy of any current legislative agenda or
8	resolution adopted by the entity.
9	(d) A person required to register as a lobbyist under
10	Chapter 305 that contracts with a governmental entity in accordance
11	with this section may not communicate directly with a member of the
12	legislative branch on behalf of the entity regarding legislation
13	pending before the legislature that specifically proposes to amend
14	Section 26.04(c) or 26.041(c), Tax Code.
15	(e) Notwithstanding other law, a governmental entity may
16	not reimburse a person required to register as a lobbyist under
17	Chapter 305 for an expenditure the person made for food, beverages,
18	or entertainment.
19	(f) If a governmental entity does not comply with the
20	requirements of this section, a resident of or person receiving
21	services from the entity may file with the Texas Ethics Commission a
22	sworn complaint against the entity in accordance with Section
23	<u>571.122.</u>
24	(g) This section does not prevent an officer or employee of
25	a governmental entity from:
26	(1) providing information to a member of the
27	legislative branch;

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1	(2) appearing before a legislative committee; or
2	(3) communicating directly with one or more members of
3	the legislative branch to influence legislation pending before the
4	legislature.
5	SECTION 2. Section 2254.030, Government Code, is repealed.
6	SECTION 3. Section 556.0056, Government Code, as added by
7	this Act, applies only to a payment described by that section made
8	under a contract entered into on or after the effective date of this
9	Act. A contract entered into before the effective date of this Act
10	under which a payment described by that section is made is governed
11	by the law in effect on the date the contract was entered into, and
12	the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
13	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the

14 last day of the legislative session.
