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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to eliminating certain state-required assessment 3 instruments and certain end-of-course assessment instruments not 4 required by federal law.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6 SECTION 1. Section 28.0211(a-8), Education Code, is amended

7 to read as follows:

(a-8) A school district may not be required to provide 8 supplemental instruction under Subsection (a-1)(2) to a student in 9 more than two subject areas per school year. If the district would 10 11 otherwise be required to provide supplemental instruction to a 12 student in more than two subject areas for a school year, the district shall prioritize providing supplemental instruction to 13 14 the student in mathematics and reading[, or Algebra I, English I, or English II, as applicable,] for that school year. 15

16 SECTION 2. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by 17 amending Subsections (a), (c), and (c-2) and adding Subsection (q) 18 to read as follows:

(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
essential knowledge and skills in reading, mathematics, [social
studies,] and science. Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), all
students, other than students assessed under Subsection (b) or (1)
or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:

(1) mathematics, annually in grades three through
 eight;
 (2) reading, annually in grades three through eight;

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(3)

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[(4)] science, in grades five and eight; and

[social studies, in grade eight;

6 (4) [(5)] any other subject and grade required by
7 federal law.

The agency shall also adopt end-of-course assessment 8 (c) instruments for secondary-level courses in reading, mathematics, 9 and science only as necessary to comply with the Every Student 10 Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. Section 6301 et seq.) to be administered 11 12 only as necessary to meet the minimum requirements of that Act [Algebra I, biology, English I, English II, and United States 13 history. The Algebra I end-of-course assessment instrument must 14 15 be administered with the aid of technology, but may include one or more parts that prohibit the use of technology. The English I and 16 17 English II end-of-course assessment instruments must each assess essential knowledge and skills in both reading and writing and must 18 provide a single score]. A school district shall comply with State 19 Board of Education rules regarding administration of the assessment 20 instruments <u>adopted under</u> [listed in] this subsection. If a 21 student is in a special education program under Subchapter A, 22 Chapter 29, the student's admission, review, and dismissal 23 24 committee shall determine whether any allowable modification is necessary in administering to the student an assessment instrument 25 required under this subsection. The State Board of Education shall 26 27 administer the assessment instruments. An end-of-course

1 assessment instrument may be administered in multiple parts over 2 more than one day. The State Board of Education shall adopt a 3 schedule for the administration of end-of-course assessment 4 instruments that complies with the requirements of Subsection 5 (c-3).

(c-2) The agency may adopt end-of-course assessment 6 courses for which end-of-course assessment 7 instruments for 8 instruments are not adopted under [not listed in] Subsection (c). A student's performance on an end-of-course assessment 9 10 instrument adopted under this subsection is not subject to the performance requirements established under Subsection (c) or 11 12 Section 39.025.

(q) Notwithstanding any provision of this section or other 13 law, if changes made to the Every Student Succeeds Act (20 U.S.C. 14 Section 6301 et seq.) reduce the number or frequency of assessment 15 instruments required to be administered to students, the State 16 Board of Education shall adopt rules reducing the number or 17 frequency of assessment instruments administered to students under 18 19 state law, and the commissioner shall ensure that students are not assessed in subject areas or in grades that are no longer required 20 to meet the minimum requirements of that Act. 21

22 SECTION 3. Sections 39.025(a-1) and (a-3), Education Code, 23 are amended to read as follows:

(a-1) A student enrolled in a college preparatory
mathematics or English language arts course under Section 28.014
who satisfies the Texas Success Initiative (TSI) college readiness
benchmarks prescribed by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating

Board under Section 51.334 on an assessment instrument designated 1 by the coordinating board under that section administered at the 2 3 end of the college preparatory mathematics or English language arts course satisfies the requirements concerning and is exempt from the 4 administration of the mathematics or reading [Algebra I or the 5 English I and English II] end-of-course assessment instrument 6 [instruments], applicable, [as prescribed by Section 7 as 8 $\frac{39.023(c)_r}{}$ even if the student did not perform satisfactorily on a previous administration of the applicable end-of-course assessment 9 10 instrument. A student who fails to perform satisfactorily on the assessment instrument designated by the coordinating board under 11 12 Section 51.334 administered as provided by this subsection may retake that assessment instrument for purposes of this subsection 13 or may take the appropriate end-of-course assessment instrument. 14

15 (a-3) A student who, after retaking an end-of-course assessment instrument for mathematics [Algebra I] or reading 16 [English II], has failed to perform satisfactorily as required by 17 Subsection (a), but who receives a score of proficient on the Texas 18 19 Success Initiative (TSI) diagnostic assessment for the corresponding subject for which the student failed to perform 20 satisfactorily on the end-of-course 21 assessment instrument satisfies the requirement concerning the mathematics [Algebra I] or 22 reading [English II] end-of-course assessment, as applicable. 23

24 SECTION 4. Section 39.203(c), Education Code, is amended to 25 read as follows:

(c) In addition to the distinction designations describedby Subsections (a) and (b), a campus that satisfies the criteria

1 developed under Section 39.204 shall be awarded a distinction 2 designation by the commissioner for outstanding performance in 3 academic achievement in <u>reading</u> [English language arts], 4 mathematics, <u>or</u> science[, or social studies].

5 SECTION 5. Section 39.023(c-9), Education Code, is 6 repealed.

7 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 8 school year.

9 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2025.
