A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to a study of alternative methods of taxation to replace
- 3 revenue lost to political subdivisions if ad valorem taxes are
- 4 abolished.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "commission" means the
- 7 Commission to Study Measures to Abolish Ad Valorem Taxes.
- 8 SECTION 2. COMPOSITION OF COMMISSION. The commission is
- 9 composed of nine members as follows:
- 10 (1) the comptroller of public accounts;
- 11 (2) three members of the senate appointed by the
- 12 lieutenant governor;
- 13 (3) three members of the house of representatives
- 14 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and
- 15 (4) two public members appointed by the governor.
- 16 SECTION 3. PRESIDING OFFICER. The comptroller of public
- 17 accounts is the presiding officer of the commission.
- 18 SECTION 4. MEETINGS. The commission shall meet at the call
- 19 of the presiding officer of the commission.
- 20 SECTION 5. STAFF. The staff of the office of the
- 21 comptroller of public accounts shall serve as the staff of the
- 22 commission.
- 23 SECTION 6. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES. A
- 24 commission member is not entitled to receive compensation for

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- 1 service on the commission but is entitled to reimbursement for
- 2 actual and necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred
- 3 by the member in performing commission duties.
- 4 SECTION 7. STUDY. The commission shall conduct a study of
- 5 alternative methods of taxation to replace revenue lost to
- 6 political subdivisions if ad valorem taxes are abolished.
- 7 SECTION 8. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2026, the
- 8 commission shall issue a report of the results of the study,
- 9 including any legislative recommendations, to the governor, the
- 10 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 11 and the presiding officer of each legislative standing committee
- 12 with jurisdiction over taxation.
- 13 SECTION 9. ABOLITION AND EXPIRATION. The commission is
- 14 abolished and this Act expires September 1, 2027.
- 15 SECTION 10. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 16 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 17 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 18 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 19 immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 20 last day of the legislative session.
