4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter N-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER N-1. FIRST RESPONDER BROADBAND NETWORK SERVICE
8	Sec. 411.411. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "First responder" has the meaning assigned by
10	Section 161.0001, Health and Safety Code.
11	(2) "First responder broadband network service" means
12	a dedicated wireless broadband communications network specifically
13	designed for use by first responders responding to natural
14	disasters or other emergencies.
15	Sec. 411.412. SELECTION OF SERVICE PROVIDER FOR DEPARTMENT
16	FIRST RESPONDERS. (a) The department shall select and procure from
17	a provider a first responder broadband network service for use by
18	first responders who are department employees. The first responder
19	broadband network service selected by the department for department
20	employees must have service availability in all areas of the state,
21	including those areas in which flooding or other natural disasters
22	are most likely to occur.
23	(b) In the event that a department employee is terminated by

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or otherwise separates from employment with the department, the

- 1 department shall inform the first responder broadband network
- 2 service provider of that fact and require the provider to cancel
- 3 that employee's access to the service.
- 4 Sec. 411.413. ASSISTANCE TO OTHER FIRST RESPONDERS. (a)
- 5 The department may assist first responders who are not department
- 6 employees to select and secure a first responder broadband network
- 7 service or to renew a first responder broadband network service
- 8 previously secured by the first responders.
- 9 (b) For purposes of Subsection (a), the department shall
- 10 <u>maintain a database that lists the first responder broadband</u>
- 11 network service providers in this state. The database must include
- 12 information that demonstrates the service area of each provider, as
- 13 well as the average broadband network service availability of the
- 14 system offered by the provider at each location within the
- 15 provider's service area.
- Sec. 411.414. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 1 of
- 17 each year, the department shall prepare and submit to the
- 18 lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives,
- 19 and each other member of the legislature an annual report that
- 20 includes:
- 21 <u>(1) an evaluation of the effectiveness of first</u>
- 22 <u>responder broadband network services</u>, the total cost of these
- 23 services to the state, and the current method of paying those costs;
- 24 (2) data on the outcomes, including failures and
- 25 successes, of first responder broadband network services during
- 26 natural disasters and other emergencies that require use of the
- 27 first responder broadband network services;

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- 1 (3) data on use of first responder broadband network
- 2 services, including the name of the provider of the service and the
- 3 number of first responders using the service offered by each
- 4 provider; and
- 5 <u>(4) recommendations for improving emergency and first</u>
- 6 responder communication operability and interoperability,
- 7 <u>increasing the resilience of first responder broadband network</u>
- 8 <u>services</u>, and enhancing resource capabilities.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 10 last day of the legislative session.
